Thursday, December 13, 2018:

We held our first STM Knights of Columbus meeting at the Our Divine Savior (ODS) parish hall. State Secretary, Dave Abbott, helped set up. Jim Collins thanked Greg Kidder and his wife Ivonne, as well as all the Knights and their wives who had been helping at the Newman Center and ODS. He thanked Supreme for sending \$10,000 in gift cards, Columbian Charities for sending a \$3,000 check for each Knight who lost his home and Supreme for helping Columbian Charities with a \$120,000 check. He also thanked Grand Knights Jim Wayne and Ed Grens for their support and Harold Frazier and Dave Lemire for setting up RVs on the ODS property. The Knights made plans for Larry Campbell's and Michael Gaukel's funerals. They also set up an Emergency Fund Committee to distribute donated funds to members in need. After the meeting, they gathered for pizza at a nearby restaurant. Even though our members were scattered, we had more than a quorum (12 members) to conduct business.



Monday, December 16, 2019: Paradise neighborhoods are abuzz with trucks, tractors, and disposal equipment clearing the last lot in our neighborhood. RVs have moved back to lots cleared of debris waiting for springtime construction.



Neighbors who plan to rebuild, have cleared their lot but cannot let go of the hulk of a burnedout truck which brings back memories for them of better times and past adventures.



PG & E subcontractors tear up our streets to replace aging power and gas lines. Roadblocks are a daily nuisance but bring hope of improved infrastructure, removal of falling trees, and clearing for new constructions.



A few blocks away, there's hope for the New Year as a neighbor is framing a new home despite the cold, the rain and the muddy conditions. The frame stands in stark contrast to the empty lots on the same street.



The first wave of stalwart, pioneering Paradise Camp Fire survivors have returned living in mobile homes in the mud planning for better days. Their resiliency is evident in the Christmas decorations surrounding their improvised lodgings. They refuse to give up and are determined to celebrate the Christmas season.



Sunday, December 29, 2019: CHRISTMAS CELEBRATION 2019: STM Women's Christmas Party:

Parishioners welcomed the SISTERS FROM THE ORDER of the EUCHARISTIC MISSIONARIES of the INFANT JESUS and OUR LADY of FATIMA. Greg Kidder promised that a group of Sisters from Mexico City would be coming to Butte County; and indeed, they arrived. The Sisters have been assigned a five-year mission to work in our area.



Thursday, June 11, 2020: Welcome Home to the Ridge: The St. Thomas More Project "Welcome Home to the Ridge" launched to Great Initial Success! Weeks before the Covid-19 pandemic forced us to suspend celebration of public Mass, we published a story in the bulletin about our intent to play a greater role in the rebuilding of Paradise through a project called Welcome Home to the Ridge. Thanks to a matching grant from the North Valley Community Foundation and the Butte Strong Fund, St. Thomas More launched a small but mighty symbol of welcome and support to new and returning homeowners. Once the homeowner takes occupancy, two or three members of the parish, wearing their parish t-shirts, will visit to present a "Welcome Home to the Ridge" gift, which includes — • A five-foot tall crepe myrtle tree from a local nursery and a gift

bag with items donated by local businesses. The first two presentations were made by Lori MacPhail and Chris Rehmann.

Before Mass, parishioners gathered at the school kitchen to make lunch preparations. In front of the church, COVOD 19 protocols were followed. Inside, pictures of three parishioners who perished in the Camp Fire were on display with those of other deceased parishioners.







After Mass, Knights and parishioners distributed hot lunches to nearly 200 in attendance. Warm food was welcome after snow had fallen at 11:08 am when bells had rung in memory of the November 8, 2018 Camp Fire. It has a bone-chilling memorial:









Throughout the day we reflected on two years of recovery and rebuilding from the ashes. There were signs of hope around town: parishioner-owned businesses open again, rebuilding efforts in every stage: planning by those living in RVs, foundations and homes under construction, and completed homes occupied by parishioners who celebrated a return to Paradise:
