LPCC stands for licensed professional clinical counselor, and it's a title for a mental health professional who treats patients with a variety of mental health conditions:

Mental illness, Emotional distress, Substance abuse, Personal trauma, Psychological disorder, Social development disorder, and Disability.

LPCCs use a combination of therapeutic activities and sometimes medication to treat their patients. They can work in a variety of healthcare settings.

LPCCs are more specifically trained than licensed professional counselors (LPCs) because of the clinical element. To become an LPC, you need to:

- Earn a master's degree with an internship
- Work under supervision for about two years
- Pass a national exam from the National Board for Certified Counselors (NBCC)
