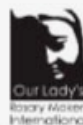


CORD ROSARY BEGINNER'S KIT

- Kit includes materials and instructions for learning to make cord rosaries. There are enough materials for making 50 rosaries. 5 bags of beads (5 different colors) 50 crucifixes, cord, & 1 cord tool. ***CENTERS NOT INCLUDED*** With a little practice making knots on a small piece of cord, one should be on their way to making cord rosaries in a short time. **Colors of beads may vary due to availability**



Easy steps to make a Cord Rosary.

Materials: Use 60 inches of cord, available in either 1/8 in. or 1 in. tubes, white only. Plastic crucifixes or base metal crucifixes, plastic beads (60 needed for each Rosary), and tool for making knot. Those supplies may be purchased from the Rosary Makers.

You will also need a pair of very sharp scissors and, we recommend, a bottle of clear nail polish or a jar of clear shellac with which to dip or brush the ends of the cord to make them stiff to easily go through the beads. This also eliminates any frayed ends.

Procedures: Use 60 inches of cord. Mark one end of cord as 8 inches for starting position. Dip or brush ends of cord with nail polish or clear shellac, if desired. Bonded cord gives the least chance of fraying, and you may decide there is no need to coat ends.

Make first knot at 8 inch starting position. Read instructions which follow and then refer to STEP 1 below. It is important to keep this 8 inches free on end. Place tool in left hand (reverse all instructions for left-handed person) and hold in a horizontal position as shown. Lay cord over grooved end of tool with grooved side facing towards you. Left thumb holds cord against the tool as right hand wraps cord around back of tool and brings it in front and crosses over the cord held by the left thumb to form an X. Remember this X is at the 8 inch starting position. Keep X in center of tool. With right hand, wrap two more loops around tool, one next to the other, working from right to left towards the handle of the tool. To secure knot, hold the loops with the left index finger;
