# **MEDITATION OF THE DAY**

How We Are Made One in Christ

**In the discourse that follows the Last Supper,** Jesus tells the disciples: The Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you. The prologue to the Gospel of John identifies the speaker of these words as the Word through whom all things were made. The content of all that I have said cannot, therefore, be

reduced to Jesus' preaching. The Word has never been silent since the world began. To heed his counsel is to remember reality as such, to let it be illumined by the light shining into and out of the empty tomb....

**The Spirit who calls to mind is called Paraclete.** The word admits of a range of interpretations. Current versions put "Comforter," "Advocate," or, as above, "Counselor." These various readings reveal different shades of an experience of inner strengthening. **The Spirit is the heart's companion**, the filler of our solitude. But he is also the one who creates community. The post-communion prayer of the Easter Vigil brings the recital of God's great deeds to a climax: "Pour out on us, Lord, the Spirit of your love, that those you have filled with Paschal sacraments may, by your kindness, be of one heart." The Spirit who, in the beginning, moved over the face of the waters (Gn 1:2) exercises the divine prerogative of making something out of nothing. By his touch, the heart of man, in its natural state deceitful above all things (Jer. 17:9), becomes capable of commitment and communion.... When the Acts of the Apostles refer to the concord of the early Church (4:32), it is to bear evidence to the Spirit's work. The ecclesia, that utterly improbable fellowship, is an icon of the unifying Spirit. –Візнор Erik Varden, o.c.s.o.

# ORACIÓN AL SAGRADO CORAZÓN


La devoción al Sagrado Corazón fue la nota característica de la piedad de Santa Gertrudis la Grande (1256-1302), monja benedictina y reconocida mística. De hecho, fue la primera gran exponente de la devoción al Sagrado Corazón. En nuestros esfuerzos por honrar al Corazón de Jesús, tenemos esta oración como modelo para la nuestra:

¡Salve! Oh Sagrado Corazón de Jesús, fuente viviente y vivificante de vida eterna, tesoro infinito de la Divinidad y horno ardiente del amor divino. Tú eres mi refugio y mi santuario, oh mi amable Salvador. Consume mi corazón con ese fuego ardiente con el que el tuyo siempre está inflamado. Derrama sobre mi alma las gracias que brotan de tu amor, y permite que mi corazón se una al tuyo de tal manera que nuestras voluntades sean una y la mía en todo se conforme a la tuya. Que tu divina voluntad sea la norma y regla de todos mis deseos y de todas mis acciones. Amén. – Saint Gertrude

#### THE DEVOTION

This devotion consists in the divine worship of the human heart of Christ, which is united to His divinity and which is a symbol of His love for us. The aim of the devotion is to make our Lord king over our hearts by prompting them to return love to Him (especially through an act of consecration by which we offer to the Heart of Jesus both ourselves and all that belongs to us) and to make reparation for our ingratitude to God.

#### PRAYER TO THE SACRED HEART

Devotion to the Sacred Heart was the characteristic note of the piety of St. Gertrude the Great (1256-1302), Benedictine nun and renowned mystic. She was, in fact, the first great exponent of devotion to the Sacred Heart. In our efforts to honor the Heart of Jesus we have this prayer as a model for our own:

Hail! O Sacred Heart of Jesus, living & quickening source of eternal life, infinite treasure of the Divinity & burning furnace of divine love. Thou art my refuge and my sanctuary, 0 my amiable Savior. Consume my heart with that burning fire with which Thine is ever inflamed. Pour down on my soul those graces which flow from Thy love, and let my heart be so united with Thine, that our wills may be one, and mine in all things be conformed to Thine. May Thy divine will be equally the standard and rule of all my desires and of all my actions. Amen. – Saint Gertrude

#### PRAYER FOR THE CHURCH

O most holy Heart of Jesus, shower Thy blessings in abundant measure upon Thy holy Church, upon the Supreme Pontiff & upon all the clergy; to the just grant perseverance; convert sinners; enlighten unbelievers; bless our relations, friends and benefactors; assist the dying; deliver the holy souls in purgatory; and extend over all hearts the sweet empire of Thy love. 

RERUM NOVARUM, OR RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF CAPITAL AND LABOR, IS AN ENCYCLICAL ISSUED BY POPE LEO XIII ON 15 MAY 1891.

But years before issuing this encyclical Pope Leo XIII experienced a frightening vision while celebrating Mass! According to the Saint Benedict Center, Pope Leo XIII had a vision on October 13, 1884, during Mass, where he witnessed Satan boasting to God that he could destroy the Church within a century.

After seeing this frightening vision: evil spirits, trying to fulfill Satan's boast to destroy our Lord's Church within a century, engaging in fierce attacks against it; and even though in his vision the Pontiff also saw St. Michael casting Satan and his demons back into Hell, he was so horrified by what he had seen that he felt compelled to help defend our faith in this struggle. In response he wrote the Prayer to St. Michael and mandated it to be recited after all Masses. The prayer seeks St. Michael's help in defending the Church against Satan and his evil spirits.

Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness & snares of the devil May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do Thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host, by the Divine Power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who roam throughout the world seeking the ruin of men's souls.

In the Saint Michael prayer [Pope Leo XIII] throws down the gauntlet to "the father of lies" as Jesus calls the devil in John's Gospel (8:44), by enlisting the help of this very special Archangel.

Saint Michael makes a great general in this fight between Christ and Satan for our souls! After all, we read in Revelation (12:7-9) that "there was a great battle in heaven; Michael and his angels fought with the dragon...and that great dragon...who is called the devil and Satan, who seduces the whole world...was cast unto the earth, and his angels continued in right column

#### The Significance of the Name Pope Leo XIV continued from left column

[the demons] were thrown down with him." His very name (in Hebrew, Micha'el meaning "Who is like God?") denotes the war cry uttered in that battle. Note that when we talk about Satan or the devil here we are also referring to his "army" of fallen angels, the evil spirits referred to in the Saint Michael prayer. As a special patron & protector of the Church, St. Michael has been assigned to fight against Satan; to protect faithful souls from him, especially at their death; to champion God's people; and, further along this line, to escort them to their judgment.

Pope Leo XIII saw to it that the Saint Michael prayer was recited after every low Mass throughout the world. Although we have fallen away from this practice in most Catholic churches, with today's climate, it may be well worth considering bringing back the practice of closing every Mass with this prayer.
