MEDITATION OF THE DAY

The Purifying Fires of God's Love

The soul was created for reaching perfection if it lives as God has ordained and does not stain itself with any sin. But having stained itself by original sin, it loses its gifts and graces and lies dead. Nor can it rise again except by God's means. And when God, by baptism, has raised it from the dead, it is still prone to evil, inclining and being led to actual sin unless it resists. And thus it dies again. Then God by another special grace raises it again....

All the divine workings of which we have spoken are needed to recall it to its first state in which God created it. Without them it could never get back there. And when the soul finds itself on the road back to its first state, its need to be

transformed in God kindles in it a fire so great that this is its purgatory....

A last act of love is done by God without help from man. So many hidden imperfections are in the soul that, did it see them, it would live in despair. But in the state of which we have spoken they are all burnt away, and only when they have gone does God show them to the soul, so that it may see the divine working which kindles the fire of love in which its imperfections have been burnt away....

If a work is to be perfect it must be wrought in us but not chiefly by us, for God's works must be done by him and not wrought chiefly by man. Such works are those last wrought in us by God of his pure love, by him alone without merit of ours.... That love for God which fills the soul to overflowing gives it, as I see it, a happiness beyond what can be told. — Saint Catherine of Genoa

Saint Catherine of Genoa († 1510) was the director of a hospital that cared for victims of the plague. HOMILY NOTES





Bienvenidos a noviembre y a la Devoción de este mes a las Santas Almas del Purgatorio. Nos

encontramos en una posición única, ya que nuestros méritos terrenales pueden ayudar a las almas del Purgatorio si ofrecemos intencionalmente a Dios nuestras oraciones, buenas obras, sacrificios y, especialmente, el Santo Sacrificio de la Misa para su alivio.

Con la caída de las hojas y el acortamiento de los días, recordamos que toda vida terrenal llega a su fin, y nuestra atención se centra en una profunda y solemne devoción: las Almas del Purgatorio. El Catecismo enseña: «Todos los que mueren en la gracia y amistad de Dios, pero aún imperfectamente purificados, tienen asegurada su salvación eterna; pero después de la

muerte, se someten a una purificación para alcanzar la santidad necesaria para entrar en la alegría del cielo» .(ccc 1030)



Welcome to November and to this month's Devotion to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. We are in a unique position in that our merits here on earth can assist the holy souls if we intentionally offer to God our prayers, good works, sacrifices, and especially the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass for their relief.

As the leaves fall & the days grow shorter, it reminds us that all earthly life comes to an end, the focus shifts to a profound and solemn devotion—the Holy Souls of Purgatory.

The Catechism teaches: "All who die in God's grace and friendship but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death, they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to

enter the joy of heaven." (ccc 1030)

La importancia de la oración por las almas santas del purgatorio

La Sagrada Escritura, los Concilios de la Iglesia, el Catecismo y los santos enseñan que es una buena y piadosa práctica rezar y hacer penitencia por los difuntos (2 Macabeos 12:45, Concilio de Trento, Canon 13, Catecismo n.º 1032). Y cuando muramos, probablemente necesitaremos la misma caridad que se nos mostró. La Iglesia sabe que tendemos a descuidar nuestras devociones y, por eso, en su sabiduría, dedica un mes a esta importante obra de misericordia espiritual. Y en su generosidad, la Iglesia nos ha brindado una oportunidad especial durante los primeros ocho días de noviembre. En cada uno de estos ocho días, los fieles pueden obtener una indulgencia plenaria por las almas del difunto, bajo las condiciones habituales (véase más abajo), visitando un cementerio y rezando por los difuntos. ¡Una indulgencia plenaria anula toda la pena temporal debida por el pecado! ¡Podemos liberar un alma del difunto cada día del 1 al 8 de noviembre!

- 1. **Visiten un cementerio** durante los primeros ocho días de noviembre para obtener una indulgencia plenaria diaria por un alma en pena. Continúen visitándolo durante todo el mes y más allá, rezando por los difuntos.
- 2. **Ofrezcan sacrificios** por las almas en pena pidiendo una misa por ellas o rezando el Rosario, una novena* o la Coronilla de la Divina Misericordia.
- 3. **Como actividad familiar,** hagan un cartel con la lista de todos los difuntos y colóquenlo en un lugar visible para que la familia recuerde rezar por sus seres queridos durante todo noviembre.
- 4. **Aprendan más sobre el Purgatorio** leyendo el Catecismo y otros escritos de los santos.
- 5. **Conversen en familia** sobre la muerte, cómo prepararse para ella, los funerales y entierros católicos y el Sacramento de la Unción de los Enfermos.
- 6. **Confesense regularmente** (el Padre Chuck recomienda hacerlo una vez al mes) para asegurarse de estar siempre en estado de gracia y así obtener una indulgencia por un alma en pena y cuidar de las suyas.

THE IMPORTANCE OF PRAYER FOR THE HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY

Sacred Scripture, the Church Councils, the Catechism, and the saints all teach that it is a good and pious practice to pray and do penance for the dead (2 Maccabees 12:45, Council of Trent, Canon 13, Catechism #1032). And when we die, we will likely need the same charity shown to us. The Church knows we are prone to become lax in our devotions and so, in Her wisdom, She sets aside a month for this important spiritual work of mercy. And in her generosity, the Church has given us a special opportunity in the first 8 days of November. On each of the first 8 days, the faithful can gain a plenary indulgence for the poor souls, under the usual conditions (see below), by visiting a cemetery and saying prayers for the dead A plenary indulgence cancels out all the temporal punishment due to sin! We can free a poor soul every day from November 1st through the 8th!

- 1. **Visit a cemetery** the first 8 days of November to obtain a Plenary Indulgence each day for a poor soul. Keep going there through the month and beyond, saying prayers for the dead while there.
- 2. **Make sacrifices for the poor souls** by having a Mass said for them or praying a Rosary, a novena*, or the Divine Mercy Chaplet.
- 3. **As a family activity, make a poster** listing all the dearly departed & put it on display so our family can be reminded to pray for our loved ones throughout November.
- 4. **Learn more about Purgatory** by reading the Catechism and other writings of the saints.
- 5. **Have family discussions** about death, preparing for death, Catholic funerals and burials, and the Sacrament of the Sick.
- 6. **Go to Confession regularly** (Fr. Chuck asks for once a month) to make sure we are always in a state of grace so we can gain an indulgence for a poor soul and take care of our own.

*Included with the Nov. 2 STM Bulletin is a booklet, "Daily Prayers for the Holy Souls in Purgatory". The prayers begin on Sunday making today the perfect day to start your 7-day devotion to your beloved dead and all holy souls in purgatory.


