**MEDITATION OF THE DAY**
Mary's Song at the Epiphany

[Mary sang:] **All the chaste daughters of the Hebrews** and virgin daughters of rulers are amazed at me. Because of you [Jesus], a daughter of the poor is envied. Because of you, a daughter of the weak is an object of jealousy. Who gave you to me? Son of the Rich One, who despised the womb of rich women, what drew you toward the poor? For Joseph is needy, and I am impoverished. Your merchants brought gold to a house of the poor.... Behold your worshippers surround me, and their offerings encircle me. Blessed be the Babe who made his mother the lyre of his melodies. And since the lyre looks toward its master, my mouth looks toward you.

Let your will arouse your mother's tongue. Since I have learned by you a new way of conceiving, let my mouth learn by you a new [way of] giving birth to new glory. If difficult things for you are not difficult but easy, so that the womb conceived you without intercourse, and without seed the womb gave birth to you, it is easy for the mouth to be fruitful and to multiply your great glory.

Behold, I am slandered and oppressed, but I rejoice. My ears are full of scorn and disdain, but it is a small matter to me how much I shall endure, for a single [word of] consolation from you is able to chase away myriads of griefs.

Since I am not despised by you, my Son, I am confident. I who am slandered have conceived and given birth to the True Judge who will vindicate me. For if Tamar was acquitted by Judah, how much more will I be acquitted by you!



Welcome to the new year! January holds a significant place in the Catholic Church's liturgical calendar. This is a time when the Church honors the Holy Name of Jesus, an observance deeply rooted in the faith's history & theology. Below, we explore the reasons behind January's dedication to the Holy Name of Jesus and list significant feast days and saints associated with this devotion. ¿POR QUÉ EL MES DE ENERO ESTÁ DEDICADO AL SANTO NOMBRE DE JESÚS?

La Iglesia Católica dedica cada mes del año a una devoción particular, y en enero se honra el Santo Nombre de Jesús. La elección de enero para esta devoción está relacionada con la Fiesta de la Circuncisión de Cristo, que se celebraba el 1 de enero, ocho días después de Navidad, según la costumbre judía. Fue en ese momento cuando Jesús recibió oficialmente su nombre, que en hebreo significa "Dios salva".

La Fiesta del Santo Nombre de Jesús, que se celebra el 3 de enero, confirma aún más esta devoción. Esta fiesta fue concedida inicialmente a los franciscanos en 1530 y desde entonces se ha extendido por toda la Iglesia. Sirve como una oportunidad para que los fieles expresen su amor y reverencia por el Santo Nombre y recuerda el poder y la santidad del nombre de Jesús, que siempre debe ser pronunciado y recibido por quien lo escucha con profundo amor, respeto y reverencia.

Enero es un mes rico en celebraciones litúrgicas centradas en Nuestro Señor y su Santísima Madre.

1. Enero comenzó con la Fiesta de la Solemnidad de María, Madre de Dios, el día 1, que destacó el papel de María en la Encarnación de su divino Hijo, cuyo nombre le fue revelado por el ángel Gabriel y formalmente dado a Jesús en este día.
2. La Fiesta del Santo Nombre de Jesús se celebró el 3 de enero.
3. La Epifanía, que se celebra hoy, 4 de enero, conmemora la visita de los Reyes Magos al niño Jesús, reconociéndolo como el Mesías y Salvador del mundo.
4. La Fiesta del Bautismo del Señor, que se celebra el domingo 11 de enero, marca el comienzo de su ministerio, confirma su identidad como Hijo de Dios y concluye la temporada navideña.

WHY JANUARY IS DEDICATED TO THE HOLY NAME OF JESUS

The Catholic Church dedicates each month of the year to a particular devotion and for January it is the Holy Name of Jesus. The choice of January for this devotion is linked to the Feast of the Circumcision of Christ, which had been celebrated on Jan. 1st, eight days after Christmas, in keeping with Jewish custom. This was when Jesus was officially given His name, which in Hebrew means "God Saves."

The Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus, celebrated on January 3rd, further confirms this dedication. This feast was initially granted to the Franciscans in 1530 and has since spread throughout the Church. It serves as an opportunity for the faithful to express love & reverence for the Holy Name and is a reminder of the power & sanctity of Jesus' name, which should always be spoken and received by the listener with profound love, respect, and reverence.

January is a month rich in liturgical celebrations focused on Our Lord and His Blessed Mother.

1. January began with the Feast of the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God on the 1st, which highlighted Mary's role in the Incarnation of Her divine Son, whose name was revealed to her by the angel Gabriel, and formally given to Jesus on this day.
2. The Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus was January 3rd.
3. The Epiphany, celebrated today, Sunday, January 4, commemorates the visit of the Magi to the baby Jesus, recognizing Him as the Messiah and Savior of the world.
4. The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, on Sunday, January 11, marks the beginning of His ministry, confirms His identity as the Son of God, and concludes the Christmas season.
