MEDITATION OF THE DAY

Praying for the Harvest

The thought which stands out in my mind as an incentive to pray for the missions is that there is not one person created for whom Christ would not have suffered and died, if that one was the only one to be saved. Each one human being is all to God. The

whole of his infinite love is given to each. In this light what a tragedy it is that there can be people who have never heard the name of Christ, and how logical that those who love him find it worth the sacrifice of self to make him known and loved....

The missionary takes more than the knowledge of Christ: he or she takes Christ himself. Priests take Christ in the sacraments. But women take Christ too. To make this clear I will tell you what a priest said to me once, years ago. He had been in a persecuting country and imprisoned. He escaped, but with both his hands cut off. He said "Never again can I lift up Christ in my hands, but I can lift him up in my heart and so can you. You can take Christ everywhere, show him to everyone. Be his monstrance."

The first woman who was Christ's monstrance, who had a missionary heart, was Our Lady. This is why it is natural to pray to her for the missions and for missionaries. When we do so we are not even asking a favor of her, but are only asking her to do what is clearly her own desire. She was, and of course is, compelled by a twofold love, which is the key to her human personality, two loves so inseparable that in her they are one love. The love of God and the love of man.

Her own glorious expression of this love in words is the Magnificat in which Our Lady, rejoicing in the wonder of her motherhood, rejoices most of all, not in her personal delight, but in the fact that her Son will go on his quest of the human heart from generation to generation. - Caryll Houselander

HOMILY NOTES		

Julio está dedicado a la Preciosísima Sangre de Nuestro Señor. La Fiesta de la Preciosísima Sangre (1 de julio) fue instituida formalmente en 1849 por el Papa Pío IX, quien se encontraba exiliado de Roma en ese

momento. Tuvo como compañero a Don Giovanni Merlini, tercer general de la Congregación de la Preciosísima Sangre de Jesucristo. Este santo sacerdote sugirió al Papa que hiciera voto de dar la fiesta de la Preciosísima Sangre a toda la Iglesia, si recuperaba el territorio papal. Sin comprometerse con el voto, el Papa inmediatamente extendió la fiesta a toda la Iglesia. En el antiguo calendario se celebraba el 1 de julio, pero los católicos [hoy] continúan esta tradición aumentando su devoción a la Preciosísima Sangre durante todo el mes de julio.

Al igual que las Sagradas Llagas de Jesús, su Preciosa Sangre merece un honor especial por su estrecha relación con la Sagrada Pasión. Este honor le fue otorgado desde el principio por los apóstoles, quienes alabaron su poder redentor. (Romanos 5:9: «Somos justificados por su sangre»; Hebreos 13:12: «Así también Jesús, para santificar al pueblo mediante su sangre, padeció fuera de la puerta»; 1 Juan 1:7: «Y la sangre de Jesucristo, su Hijo, nos limpia de todo pecado»).

Una de las indulgencias asociadas a la devoción a la Preciosa Sangre: Ofrecer la siguiente oración diariamente durante el mes de julio con la intención de obtener una indulgencia: Esto significa pedir a Dios la gracia de una indulgencia por los méritos de la Preciosa Sangre.

Nota: Si bien la oración en sí no garantiza indulgencias, es una devoción poderosa que puede ofrecerse con la intención de obtenerlas.

La Sangre que corría por las venas de Cristo era parte de esa Sagrada Humanidad, hecha posible por la maternidad de María, cuyos padres, San Joaquín y Santa Ana, son honrados el 26 de julio. La sangre de nuestro Señor, derramada en la Cruz, compró nuestra salvación, lavó las vestiduras de los mártires y dio a luz a la Iglesia al fluir de su costado herido. La Preciosa Sangre de Cristo, que ahora late en su Cuerpo Místico, continúa su obra salvífica, preservando, purificando, reparando y nutriendo para la regeneración y renovación de sus miembros.

Santa Catalina de Siena



July is dedicated to the Most Precious Blood of Our Lord. The Feast of the Precious Blood (July 1) was formally instituted in 1849 by Pope Pius IX who was in exile from Rome at that time. He had as his companion Don

Giovanni Merlini, the third general of the Congregation of the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. This saintly priest suggested to the pope that he make a vow to give the feast of the Precious Blood to the entire church, if he should regain the papal territory. Without binding himself by the vow, the pope immediately extended the feast to the whole Church. On the old calendar it was celebrated July 1, but Catholics [today] continue this tradition by increasing their devotion to the most precious Blood for the entire month of July.

Like the Sacred Wounds of Jesus, His Precious Blood deserves special honor because of its close relation to the Sacred Passion. That honor was given to it from the beginning by the Apostles who praised its redeeming power. (Rom. 5:9 "we are justified by His blood"; Heb. 13:12 "and so Jesus also, that He might sanctify the people by His blood, suffered outside the gate"; 1 John 1:7 "and the blood of Jesus Christ, His Son, cleanses us from all sin.")

One of the indulgences attached to devotion to the Precious Blood:

- Offer the prayer below daily in July with the intention of gaining an indulgence: This means asking God for the grace of an indulgence through the merits of the Precious Blood.
 - Note: While the prayer itself doesn't guarantee indulgences, it is a powerful devotion that can be offered with the intention of gaining them.

The Blood that coursed thru the veins of Christ was a part of that Sacred Humanity made possible by the maternity of Mary, whose parents, St. Joachim and St. Anne are honored on July 26. Our Lord's blood poured out on the Cross purchased our salvation, washed clean the robes of the martyrs, and gave birth to the Church as it flowed from his wounded side. The Precious Blood of Christ – now pulsing through his Mystical Body – continues its salvific work, preserving and purifying, repairing and providing nourishment for regeneration and renewal of its members.

Precious Blood, Ocean of Divine Mercy: Flow upon us. Precious Blood, Most pure Offering: Procure us every grace! Precious Blood, Hope and Refuge of sinners: Atone for us! Precious Blood, Delight of holy souls: Draw us! Amen.

Carlo Acutis & Pier Giorgio Frassati to be canonized Sept. 7

Islander Catholic experience here in the

Blessed Carlo Acutis & Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati, two young Catholics beloved for their vibrant faith and witness to holiness, will be canonized together on Sept. 7 in a canonization Mass in St. Peter's Square. Acutis, who died of leukemia in 2006 at age 15, will become the first millennial to be declared a saint by the Catholic Church. Shortly before his death, Acutis offered his suffering from cancer "for the pope & for the Church." Many testified to the Vatican how he brought them closer to God.

Frassati, an avid mountaineer, who died at age 24 in 1925, is also beloved by many today for his enthusiastic witness to holiness that reaches "to the heights." A Third Order Dominican, known for his charitable outreach, was son of the founder of Italian newspaper La Stampa. Frassati died of polio on July 4, 1925, which his doctors later speculated was caught while serving the sick.
