MEDITATION OF THE DAY

The Grace of Discipleship

"As little infants you must be born anew till Jesus Christ is formed in you"



(cf. Gal 4:19). To have Jesus Christ formed in us is to think as he did, to speak as he spoke, and will as he willed.... This labor must be commenced with sweetness and cheerfulness and persevered in with tranquility and composure of mind, never frightened at the task, but believing that Jesus Christ can and will effect this new birth

within us.... He must be recognized in our conduct, meek and humble as he was, and this not only in the exterior, but chiefly in our hearts. Ever complying, ever forbearing, ever charitable, ever compassionate to the weakness and frailties of others....

When Jesus Christ calls on us to renounce all for his sake, it is not his intention to leave us friendless or without comfort, but to fill up the vacuum in our hearts with himself, that is, with delights far surpassing any the world could bestow, and a happiness such as the inhabitants of heaven alone can enjoy....

If we read of extraordinary things, miracles, etc., being performed by some of the saints, God permitted this not as a testimony of their sanctity, but for the conversion of those who were witnesses of them.... There are more saints in heaven that never did anything extraordinary, and who have perhaps attained a far greater degree of glory than those whose lives were remarkable for great actions. It is not the action but the spirit that actuates it to which God looks and according to which he will judge and reward us. —Venerable Catherine McAuley, R.S.M.

HOMILY NOTES		

La devoción a Nuestra Señora de los Dolores destaca el mes de septiembre.

Esta devoción nos fue dada por Santa Brígida de Suecia (1303-1373), a quien se le reveló que la devoción a los Siete Dolores de la Santísima Virgen traería grandes gracias. Santo Tomás Moro celebrará la Conmemoración de Nuestra Señora de los Dolores el martes 16 de septiembre en la misa de las 18:00 (que sigue al sacramento de la reconciliación).



The Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows highlights of the month of September. This devotion is given to us by St. Bridget of Sweden (1303–1373) to whom it was revealed that devotion to the Blessed Virgin's Seven Sorrows would bring great graces. St. Thomas More will celebrate the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows on Tuesday, Sept. 16 at the 6p Mass (which follows the sacrament of reconciliation.)

La devoción a Nuestra Señora de los Dolores se convirtió en un estándar en la Iglesia alrededor del siglo XIV y varios Papas la fomentaron.

En 1692, el papa Inocencio XII autorizó una fiesta en honor a Nuestra Señora de los Dolores el tercer domingo de septiembre. El papa Pío VII introdujo la fiesta litúrgica en toda la Iglesia latina en 1814; durante el siglo XVIII, el papa Benedicto XIII fomentó la devoción y otorgó indulgencias por la recitación de la Coronilla de los Siete Dolores, y el papa Clemente XII reafirmó posteriormente esta práctica. Más recientemente, el papa Pío X fijó la festividad del 15 de septiembre para que se celebrara el día después de la Exaltación de la Cruz; el papa Francisco animó a los católicos a reflexionar sobre los Siete Dolores de María como fuente de compasión y fe, especialmente en tiempos de sufrimiento.

Seguramente te has preguntado por qué existen dos fiestas casi idénticas para Nuestra Señora de los Dolores: una en septiembre y otra el Viernes Santo. Es sencillo: mientras que la Cuaresma se centra más en los sufrimientos de Nuestra Señora por la Pasión de su divino Hijo, la Fiesta de Nuestra Señora de los Siete Dolores, que se celebra el 15 de septiembre o en torno a esa fecha, se centra más en los numerosos sacrificios de Nuestra Señora a lo largo de su vida.

Los Siete Dolores de María

Esta devoción a Nuestra Señora de los Dolores consiste en rezar siete Avemarías mientras se medita cada uno de los Siete Dolores de María.

- * Primer Dolor: La Profecía de Simeón (Lucas 2:34-35)
- Segundo Dolor: La Huida a Egipto (Mateo 2:13-21)
- * Tercer Dolor: La Pérdida de Jesús por Tres Días (Lucas 2:41-50)
- * Cuarto Dolor: La Carga de la Cruz (Juan 19:17)
- * Quinto Dolor: La Crucifixión de Jesús (Juan 19:18-30)
- * Sexto Dolor: Jesús Es Bajado de la Cruz (Juan 19:39-40)
- * Séptimo Dolor: Jesús Es Colocado en el Sepulcro (Juan 19:39-42)

(Añade 7 Avemarías al final de cada reflexión.)

Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows became a standard in the Church around the 14th century with several Popes encouraging it –

Pope Innocent XII, in 1692, authorized a Feast to honor Our Lady of Sorrows on the third Sunday of Sept. Pope Pius VII introduced the liturgical feast to the entire Latin Church in 1814; during the 18th century Pope Benedict XIII encouraged the devotion, bestowing indulgences for the recitation of the Chaplet of the 7 Sorrows, and Pope Clement XII later reaffirmed this practice. More recently, Pope Pius X set the feast day in Sept (15) to be celebrated on the day after the Exaltation of the Cross; Pope Francis encouraged Catholics to reflect on the Seven Sorrows of Mary as a source of compassion and faith especially during times of suffering.

You've no doubt wondered why is it that two nearly identical feasts for Our Lady of Sorrows exist - one in September, one on Passion Friday? It's simple: while the Lenten Feast concentrates more on the sufferings of our Lady for the Passion of her divine Son, the Feast of Our Lady of the Seven Sorrows, on or around Sept. 15, focuses more on the many sacrifices of our Lady throughout her life.

THE SEVEN SORROWS (DOLORS) OF MARY

This devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows consists of praying seven Hail Mary's while meditating on each of the Seven Sorrows of Mary.

- * 1st Sorrow: The Prophecy of Simeon (Luke 2:34-35)
- * 2nd Sorrow: The Flight into Egypt (Matthew 2:13-21)
- * 3rd Sorrow: The Loss of Jesus for Three Days (Luke 2:41-50)
- * 4th Sorrow: The Carrying of the Cross (John 19:17)
- * 5th Sorrow: The Crucifixion of Jesus (John 19:18-30)
- * 6th Sorrow: Jesus Taken Down from the Cross (John 19:39-40)
- * 7th Sorrow: Jesus Laid in the Tomb (John 19:39-42)

(Add 7 Hail Mary's to the end of each reflection.)
