

MEDITATION OF THE DAY How Christ Continues to Touch and Heal Us

is the sanctified one, the “bride,” that is, the chosen vessel of grace. She is the place where the holiness of God is enthroned presently and visibly. She is all this because in the sacraments, in the Sacrament, the Lord himself meets and touches us.... She is also all this, and in a way even more, because the visible, bodily appearance of Christ—the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared (Ti 3:4)—continues in the saints, indeed in the flesh, until the end of time.

The Church herself is the “vine”...of the holiness of God dwelling on earth.... She is the “mother” of the saints in the strictest sense of the word, one might say in the biological sense, not just in the sense of one who rears a child. She “births” the saints into the world; they are nourished by her substance, bearing the features of God and hers as well. And she is not only the mother of those who are in the past, the historical ones, the already perfected saints, but also of the ones who are present, hidden, becoming; and she will, for as long as the world exists, in spite of all decay and corruption, all degeneration and catastrophe, always give birth to new, future saints....

She has already given birth to us; before any choice of our own, we are already marked with the indelible seal.... It is up to us to dare to talk to God, that is, to dare true prayer. Up to us to fall back on the seal of strength given in confirmation, like how one raises a sunken treasure up from a well. Up to us to really nourish ourselves from the “bread of life,” though that means to do so as one uses food—regularly, adequately, not as a rare, solemn, or “formal” exception. Up to us, again and again, when the accumulated and tenacious filth of incessant failure becomes for us like lumps of clay so heavy on our soles that it inhibits walking, that we seek an alleviating purification and impetus for a new start in the sacrament of forgiveness...[and] internalize into ourselves the limitless possibility of what God can do with man....

In the saints...as first-fruits and harbingers of the new creation (2 Cor 5:17), which outlasts death and decline, is embodied the meaning, the success, that which from the beginning is intended as the ultimate goal: the unity of the whole world with God who is distant and yet so near.

HOMILY NOTES

¡Bienvenidos a septiembre! Este mes se dedica tradicionalmente al honor de Nuestra Señora de los Dolores en gran parte debido a la Fiesta de Nuestra Señora de los Dolores que este año cae el domingo 15 de septiembre y también rezamos el Rosario a las 10 a.m. ese día.

Todos los dolores de María se fusionan en el sufrimiento supremo de la Pasión. En la Pasión, María sufrió un martirio del corazón a causa de los tormentos de Nuestro Señor y de la grandeza de su amor por Él.

Junto a la cruz de Jesús estaban su madre y la hermana de su madre, María, esposa de Clopas, y María Magdalena. Cuando Jesús vio allí a su madre y al discípulo a quien amaba, dijo a su madre: Mujer, ahí tienes a tu hijo. Luego dijo al discípulo: "Ahí tienes a tu madre". Y desde aquella hora el discípulo la recibió en su casa (Jn 19,25-27).

Affidamento Jesús, al ver a su Madre, la confía al discípulo amado. Esto casi representa Su última voluntad y testamento. Hace de María la Madre del discípulo y hace del discípulo el hijo de la Madre. "La llevó a su casa", es decir, a su lugar más íntimo, a todo lo que más ama. Jesús no dejó sola a su Madre. La confió al cuidado de su amado discípulo, a quien lo siguió hasta el último.

Mujer Se usa la misma palabra que en Caná, casi como si hubiera una conexión entre los dos pasajes. En Caná, la hora de Jesús aún no había llegado, mientras que en la Cruz sí. La Cruz se convierte en el acontecimiento que Caná profetizó. Al utilizar el término "mujer", Jesús se refiere a Eva: "Ésta será llamada mujer" (Gn 2,23). María es la nueva Eva.

Discípulo Jesús confía a su Madre al discípulo. Este discípulo, nos dice la tradición, representa a toda la Iglesia. María está confiada a la Iglesia, y la Iglesia está confiada a María, Madre de Jesús, primera discípula de su Hijo.

Madre y discípulo Para todos nosotros, María es la Madre de su Hijo, nuestro Señor Jesús. Pero ella es también Discípula del Maestro, quien mejor que nadie puede ayudarnos a crecer en la Escuela de su Hijo. Ella, más que nadie, supo permanecer fiel en esta Escuela, hasta el punto de permanecer "de pie" al pie de la Cruz. Esta fidelidad le hizo sufrir un martirio interior: "Y a ti misma te traspasará una espada", había predicho Simeón (Lc 2,35).

Welcome to September! This month is traditionally dedicated to the honor of Our Lady of Sorrows largely due to the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows which falls this year on Sunday, Sept. 15 and we also pray the Rosary at 10A on that day. All the sorrows of Mary are merged in the supreme suffering at the Passion. In the Passion, Mary suffered a martyrdom of the heart because of Our Lord's torments and the greatness of her love for Him.

Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there whom he loved he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son." Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his home (Jn 19:25-27).

Affidamento Seeing His Mother, Jesus entrusts her to the beloved disciple. This almost represents His last will and testament. It makes Mary the Mother of the disciple, and makes the disciple the Mother's son. "He took her into his home", that is, into his most intimate place, into everything he holds most dear. Jesus did not leave His Mother alone. He entrusted her to the care of his beloved disciple, to the one who followed him to the last.

Woman The same word is used as at Cana, almost as if there is a connection between the two passages. At Cana, Jesus's hour had not yet come, whereas on the Cross, it had. The Cross becomes the event that Cana prophesied. By using the term, "woman", Jesus refers to Eve: "This one shall be called 'woman'" (Gn 2:23). Mary is the new Eve

Disciple Jesus entrusts His Mother to the disciple. This disciple, tradition tells us, represents the entire Church. Mary is entrusted to the Church, and the Church is entrusted to Mary, the Mother of Jesus, the first disciple of her Son.

Mother and disciple For all of us, Mary is the Mother of her Son, our Lord, Jesus. But she is also a Disciple of the Master, the one who can help us better than anyone else to grow in her Son's School. More than anyone else, she knew how to remain faithful in this School, to the point that she remained "standing" at the foot of the Cross. This fidelity caused her to suffer an interior martyrdom: "And you yourself a sword will pierce", Simeon had foretold (Lk 2:35).

Notice of Deadline for Filing Claims: October 1, 2024

YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

On April 1, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Sacramento aka Diocese of Sacramento filed a chapter 11 bankruptcy petition for protection under title 11 of the United States Code.

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim so as to be received by October 1, 2024, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Diocese.

Claims based on acts or omissions of the Diocese that occurred before April 1, 2024, must be filed on or before October 1, 2024, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before April 1, 2024.

El 1 de abril de 2024, el Obispo Católico Romano de Sacramento, también conocido como Diócesis de Sacramento, presentó una petición de bancarrota del capítulo 11 para obtener protección bajo el título 11 del Código de los Estados Unidos.

Si usted fue abusado sexualmente por cualquier persona relacionada con la Diócesis, debe presentar su reclamo para que se reciba antes del 1 de octubre de 2024, o de lo contrario, se le prohibirá y excluirá para siempre hacer valer dicha reclamación contra la Diócesis.

Las reclamaciones basadas en actos u omisiones de la Diócesis que ocurrieron antes del 1 de abril de 2024, deben presentarse el 1 de octubre de 2024 o antes, incluso si dichas reclamaciones no están ahora fijas, liquidadas o ciertas o no se vencieron o se volvieron fijas, liquidadas o ciertas antes del 1 de abril de 2024.
