MEDITATION OF THE DAY

The Glory of Holy Mother Church

The Church is precious; it was created by God on the cross, when they pierced Christ's heart with the lance. The Church was created to be part of God! The Church is holy. The Church is something precious, mystical, beautiful...and beyond all understanding....

The human Church, the people of God –of course, they will make mistakes. Who doesn't? But notwithstanding all its human sinfulness, out of this community of love comes something fantastic, transparent, beautiful, beyond our kenning, whose head is indeed the Son of God, and whose Bride she is. She encompasses us all, such as we are. That is the Church we belong to. It's easy to criticize. It's easy to say, "With all that's happening in the Church, you want me to stay there?" ... We talk like this

because our faith needs strengthening. Faith is like a light. Faith is like a curtain rising, to show the beauty of what is behind. Faith changes everything....

The Church is holy: "one, holy." I personally would die for the Church. The Christ in priests is what matters. It is He who is of the essence. At Mass, when you come to the consecration, it's the word of Christ that matters.... Touch the Church, and you touch God. We need to examine this prayerfully.... Where Jesus Christ is, there is the Church. People say, "I believe in Jesus, but not in the Church." But you can't separate Jesus and the Church: it's impossible. Where Jesus Christ is, there is the Church....

Mysteriously, the Church comes from the very heart of the Lord, and is given to us to come close to the heart of the Father... When you begin to love the Church, you begin to enter into its mystery.... As you enter, you will enter into the heart of Christ. And he will take you by the hand & bring you to his Father. — Servant of God Catherine de Hueck Doherty



HOMILY NOTES

Noviembre es el mes de la Devoción a las Santas Almas del Purgatorio. Nos encontramos en una posición única, ya que nuestros méritos terrenales pueden ayudar a las almas del Purgatorio si ofrecemos intencionalmente a Dios nuestras oraciones, buenas obras, sacrificios y, especialmente, el Santo Sacrificio de la Misa para su alivio.

Con la caída de las hojas y el acortamiento de los días, recordamos que toda vida terrenal llega a su fin, y nuestra atención se centra en una profunda y solemne devoción: las Almas del Purgatorio. El Catecismo enseña: «Todos los que mueren en la gracia y amistad de Dios, pero aún imperfectamente purificados, tienen asegurada su salvación eterna; pero después de la muerte, se someten a una purificación para alcanzar la santidad necesaria para entrar en la alegría del cielo» .(ccc 1030)



November is the month for Devotion to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. We are in a unique position in that our merits here on earth can assist the holy souls if we intentionally offer to God our prayers, good works, sacrifices, and especially the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass for their relief.

As the leaves fall & the days grow shorter, it reminds us that all earthly life comes to an end and focus shifts to a profound & solemn devotion—the Holy Souls of Purgatory. The Catechism teaches: "All who die in God's grace and friendship but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death, they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven." (ccc 1030)

Una pregunta sobre el purgatorio

Si alguna vez te han preguntado o te has preguntado si el purgatorio es real, aquí tienes un poco de información al respecto.

Q. ¿Existe el purgatorio en la Biblia?

A. La palabra «Purgatorio» no aparece en las Escrituras, pero la posibilidad de la purificación después de la muerte sí se plantea de forma incipiente. Por ejemplo, en el libro de los Macabeos, Judas Macabeo envía una ofrenda al Templo en nombre de sus hombres caídos que habían cometido un acto supersticioso (véase 2 Macabeos 12:39-45). Si bien este texto bíblico católico no figura en la Biblia protestante, debido a su eliminación por los reformadores, no obstante da testimonio de la fe de Israel en el siglo II a. C.

En el Nuevo Testamento (Mateo 5:25-26), nuestro Señor nos aconseja arreglar nuestros asuntos antes de comparecer ante el juez, pues de lo contrario podríamos ser encarcelados, donde permaneceríamos hasta saldar nuestra deuda. Este es un principio básico de justicia: las deudas con Dios deben ser saldadas. No podemos pagar nuestra deuda con Él, pues es infinita. Cristo pagó esa deuda, uniendo nuestra naturaleza a la Su Divina Naturaleza, y recibimos el perdón cuando nos volvemos a Él arrepentidos, a través de aquellos a quienes Él designó para este propósito (véase Juan 20:21-23; 2 Corintios 3:5-6). La culpa temporal, debido a las consecuencias en nosotros, en los demás y en el orden social, permanece, y debemos saldarla en la medida de nuestras posibilidades: devolviendo el dinero robado, reparando el daño a la reputación de alquien, pidiendo perdón a quien hemos herido física, emocional y moralmente, etc., si no en esta vida, en la venidera. Son estas deudas que podemos reparar las que no podemos simplemente ignorar, ni en vida ni en la muerte.

A QUESTION ABOUT PURGATORY

If you've ever been asked or have questioned whether purgatory is real, here's a bit of background.

Q. Is purgatory Biblical?

A. The word "Purgatory" does not appear in Scripture, but the possibility of purification after death certainly does in undeveloped form. For example, in the book of Maccabees, Judas Maccabee sends an offering to the Temple on behalf of his fallen men who had committed a superstitious act (see 2Maccabees 12: 39-45). While this Catholic biblical text is not in the Protestant Bible, due to its removal by the Reformers, it nonetheless witnesses to the faith of Israel in the second century B.C.

In the New Testament (Matthew 5:25-26), Our Lord advises us to settle our affairs prior to going before the judge, or else we may be thrown into prison, where we remain until our debt is paid. This is a basic principle of justice: debts of justice must be paid. We cannot pay our debt to God, for it is infinite. Christ paid that debt, uniting our nature to His Divine Nature, and we receive forgiveness when we turn to Him in repentance through those whom He appointed for this purpose (see John 20:21-23; 2 Corinthians 3:5-6). The temporal guilt, due to the consequences in us, in others, in the good order of society, remains, and we must settle them to the extent we are able - returning stolen money, correcting injury to someone's good name, asking forgiveness of someone we hurt, physically, emotionally, morally, and so on - if not in this life, in the next. It's these debts within our power to repair we can't simply set aside, whether in life or in death.
