

sensible love. How often I have heard the objection, "I tell Jesus that I love him, but I don't feel it. It seems to me that I'm not being sincere." Not to doubt that you love him when you feel cold and arid demands great faith, the forgetting of yourself, and a true understanding of sanctity. The greatest saints passed through the dark night of the soul, painful periods of dryness. Yet in those hours of purification, they loved. Love is not sensible piety. Never forget this distinction.

Holiness is a disposition of the soul, of the heart, and, above all, of the will, toward God; the senses may play a role, but that is not necessary. Little Thérèse writes that dryness was her daily bread, but that she was nevertheless the happiest of creatures. She defined sanctity as "a disposition of the heart which makes us humble and small in the arms of God, conscious of our weakness, and confident to the point of audacity in the goodness of our Father."

Love is the uniting of our will to the will of God. It is abandoning ourselves totally into his hands, as a habitual disposition, even if we feel nothing. When Jesus sees this disposition in our hearts, he looks on us as his cherished children. Is not a father very indulgent toward his child? He finds excuses for his child's failings, and he admires the least of his good qualities. Jesus is like this with those who are his children, because they sincerely want to be such.

However persistently he repeats to us in the Gospel, Fear not; it is I, the fear is still there: "If I go to him, what will he ask of me? What will he require of me? I am afraid; I wouldn't want to hurt him, to wound him. As for completely giving myself to him, that is risking too much." But it is just this fear that wounds him. Saint Teresa of Ávila observes that the Samaritan, the Canaanite woman, and Mary Magdalene were not dead to the world when they found Jesus. Saint Francis de Sales said, "We must begin with love, continue with love, and end with love." When a religious sister had told him, "I wish to acquire love through humility," he replied, "And I wish to acquire humility through love." — FATHER JEAN DU CŒUR DE JÉSUS D'ELBÉE

¡Bienvenidos a octubre! Este mes está dedicado al Santo Rosario. Según el dominico del siglo XV, Alan de la Roch, María se apareció a Santo Domingo en 1206 después de que él había estado orando y haciendo severas penitencias debido a su falta de éxito en la lucha contra la herejía albigense. María lo elogió por su valiente lucha contra los herejes y luego le dio el Rosario como un arma poderosa, explicándole

sus usos y eficacia, y le dijo que lo predicara a otros. Si consideramos el poder del Rosario visto en sus efectos, encontramos gran abundancia de pruebas de su maravilloso valor.


El poder del Rosario para dar forma a los acontecimientos mundiales

A lo largo de la historia, hemos visto muchos grandes triunfos del Rosario:

- La tradición temprana atribuye al Rosario la derrota de los albigenses en la batalla de Muret en 1213.
- La victoria cristiana en la batalla de Lepanto el 7 de octubre de 1571 se atribuyó a masas de europeos y 80.000 soldados que rezaban el Rosario. Esta batalla naval entre una flota de la Santa Liga (una coalición de estados católicos organizada por el Papa Pío V) y el Imperio Otomano en el Golfo de Patras, infligió una gran derrota a los turcos.
- Otra gran victoria sobre los turcos, que una vez, como los rusos, amenazaron con la ruina de la civilización cristiana, se produjo el 5 de agosto de 1716, cuando el príncipe Eugenio los derrotó en Peterwardein, Hungría. Entonces Clemente XI extendió la fiesta del Rosario a toda la Iglesia.
- Durante la Primera Guerra Mundial, el gobierno de los Estados Unidos encargó un Rosario especial disponible para los soldados católicos que lo solicitaran.
- Durante la Segunda Guerra Mundial, ocho misioneros alemanes, que rezaban el Rosario diariamente en Hiroshima, Japón, salieron ilesos después de que la bomba atómica destruyera todo a su alrededor el 6 de agosto de 1945.
- Después de la Segunda Guerra Mundial, los austriacos atribuyeron los rosarios diarios a defenderse con éxito de la toma de poder comunista después de la guerra.

En estos ejemplos, la intercesión de Nuestra Señora tuvo un impacto masivo en las vidas de innumerables personas y en la historia del mundo. Como puede ver, realmente no hay límite para el poder de nuestras oraciones marianas de intervención. Grande o pequeño, el corazón de Nuestra Señora está abierto a todas y cada una de nuestras oraciones por el bien de este mundo. La respuesta a esas oraciones depende de su sabiduría y de la voluntad de nuestro Padre.

Welcome to October! This month is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. According to the 15th century Dominican, Alan de la Roch, Mary appeared to St. Dominic in 1206 after he had been praying & doing severe penances because of his lack of success in combating the Albigensian heresy. Mary praised him for his valiant fight against the

heretics and then gave him the Rosary as a mighty weapon – explaining its uses and efficacy— and told him to preach it to others. If we consider the power of the Rosary as seen in its effects, we find a great abundance of proofs of its wonderful value.

The Power of the Rosary to Shape World Events

Throughout history, we've seen many great triumphs of the Rosary:

- Early tradition attributes the defeat of the Albigensians at the Battle of Muret in 1213 to the Rosary.
- The Christian victory at the Battle of Lepanto on Oct. 7, 1571, was attributed to masses of Europeans & 80-thousand warriors praying the Rosary. This naval battle between a fleet of the Holy League (a coalition of Catholic states arranged by Pope Pius V) and the Ottoman Empire, in the Gulf of Patras, inflicted a major defeat on the Turks.
- Another great victory over the Turks, who once, like the Russians, threatened the ruin of Christian civilization, occurred on August 5, 1716, when Prince Eugene defeated them at Peterwardein in Hungary. Afterward, Clement XI extended the feast of the Rosary to the whole Church.
- During World War I the U.S. Gov't commissioned a special Rosary available to Catholic soldiers upon request.
- During WWII eight German missionaries, who prayed the Rosary daily in Hiroshima, Japan, walked away unscathed after the atomic bomb destroyed everything around them on Aug. 6, 1945.
- Following WWII, Austrian's attributed daily rosaries to successfully fending off communist takeover after the war.

In these examples, Our Lady's intercession had massive impact on the lives of countless people and the history of the world. As you can see, there is truly no limit to the power of our Marian prayers for intervention. Big or small, Our Lady's heart is open to any and all of our prayers for the good in this world. How those prayers will be answered is up to her wisdom and our Father's will.


In recognition of World Priest Day, here are six ways to celebrate Fr. Chuck and all priests:
