missionaries, past and present. They could not contain within themselves the love which filled their spirits. As human love overflows from the embrace of the couple into the children, who have been described as "love made visible," so the missionary's love makes visible new children in Christ. It is in terms of this intensity of love that the extraordinary sacrifices of the saints can be understood as heroic instead of insane. As the Song of Songs proclaims: Were one to offer all he owns to purchase love, he would be roundly mocked (8:7). We should give all for the pearl of great price, which is Christ. Just as all married couples are called to love each other for their whole lives, no matter the sacrifices involved, so it is the teaching of the Church that every man is called to become a saint. In the words of Christ: You cannot give yourself to God and money. Take up your cross and follow me. Enter by the narrow gate. The lukewarm I will spit out of my mouth. For most of us, love, human and divine, is desirable up to the point of suffering and sacrifice. Or, if at first we feel that we would do anything for the person we love, gradually our fervor dies. When we try to pinpoint how this happens, I think we would often find that a time came when a sacrifice was demanded of us which we refused to make. This decision is not always made in full consciousness. The moment of the test comes, we let it pass, we forget it; and then one day we discover that our life is not being lived out of intensity of commitment....

Reading the lives of the saints, we are struck by the presence of turning points when these lovers of Christ took up the great challenge. Their love of the good was so great that they staked their lives to win the battle against the evils which surrounded them. As a result of this same "all or nothing" attachment to the good, they were able to overcome in themselves every fault which would make them lazy, inept, betraying servants of Christ....

If we wish to love with all the intensity of our being, then we must be ready to sacrifice all things which prevent us from being loving every moment of the day. — RONDA CHERVIN

iBienvenidos a octubre! Este mes está dedicado al Santo Rosario. Según el dominico del siglo XV, Alan de la Roch, María se apareció a Santo Domingo en 1206 después de que él había estado orando y haciendo severas penitencias debido a su falta de éxito en la lucha contra la herejía albigense. María lo elogió por su valiente lucha contra los herejes y luego le dio el Rosario como un arma poderosa, explicándole

sus usos y eficacia, y le dijo que lo predicara a otros. Si consideramos el poder del Rosario visto en sus efectos, encontramos gran abundancia de pruebas de su maravilloso valor.

El poder del Rosario en nuestra vida cotidiana

En tiempos de dificultad y desolación, es un gran consuelo poder volver toda nuestra esperanza hacia nuestra Madre Santísima y nuestro Salvador, su Hijo. Sor Lucía, una de las videntes de Fátima, dijo: "No hay problema, les digo, por difícil que sea, que no podamos resolver con el rezo del Santo Rosario". Escuchamos hablar de muchos de estos problemas en la Misa durante las Oraciones de los Fieles: violencia. hambre, pobreza, desastres naturales, enfermedades... En la Misa, oramos juntos por el fin de estos "problemas" semana tras semana. Pero la belleza del Rosario es que, al meditar continuamente sobre los misterios de la vida de Jesús, podemos comenzar a asumir su manera de pensar y actuar. Para decirlo de manera más bíblica, nos revestimos de la mente de Cristo. Él aumenta; disminuimos. Por eso, ya sean grandes o pequeños nuestros problemas, con una actitud cristiana podemos empezar a afrontarlos. Entonces, ¿cómo nos ayuda esto a resolver los problemas del mundo? Pensemos en Gandhi, quien dijo: "Sé el cambio que guieres ver en el mundo".


Al abrir nuestros corazones a Jesús a través de esta devoción mariana, estamos dando pasos para convertirnos en el cambio que nos gustaría ver y, por lo tanto, resolver los problemas del mundo, una persona a la vez.

Welcome to October! This month is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. According to the 15th century Dominican, Alan de la Roch, Mary appeared to St. Dominic in 1206 after he had been praying & doing severe penances because of his lack of success in combating the Albigensian heresy. Mary praised him for his valiant fight against the

heretics and then gave him the Rosary as a mighty weapon – explaining its uses and efficacy— and told him to preach it to others. If we consider the power of the Rosary as seen in its effects, we find a great abundance of proofs of its wonderful value.

The Power of the Rosary in Our Everyday Lives

In times of difficulty and desolation, it's such a consolation to be able to turn all of our hope toward our Blessed Mother and our Savior, her Son. Sister Lucia, one of the visionaries of Fatima, said, "There is no problem, I tell you, no matter how difficult it is, that we cannot solve by the prayer of the Holy Rosary." We hear about many of these problems at Mass during the Prayers of the Faithful: violence, hunger, poverty, natural disasters, disease... In the Mass, we pray together for an end to these "problems" week after week. But the beauty of the Rosary is that, by continually meditating upon the mysteries of Jesus' life, we can begin to take on His way of thinking and acting. To put it more biblically, we put on the mind of Christ. He increases; we decrease. So, whether our problems are big or small, with a Christlike outlook we can begin to take them on. So, how does this help us solve the world's problems? Consider Gandhi, who said, "Be the change you want to see in the world."

In opening our hearts to Jesus through this Marian devotion, we are taking steps toward becoming the change we'd like to see – and thus, solving the world's problems, one person at a time.

The point of the Rosary, as with any form of prayer, is not that we're changing others, or even changing situations or circumstances. The point of the Rosary is that we're allowing the Lord to transform our hearts, and by transforming our hearts, He makes us a light to shine for others.

And when His light shines through you into the darkness, the darkness of the world can't overcome it (cf. John 1:5).


In recognition of World Priest Day, here are six ways to celebrate Fr. Chuck and all priests:
