MEDITATION OF THE DAY

Following the Voice of the Shepherd

Everything is grace. Only the shepherd's call and the

recognition from divine love decides who belongs to the flock. To hear and follow the well-known voice is all that is required of man; not justice or achievement. For all have sinned and suffered the loss of the glory of God. Those who are justified are justified by the gift of his grace through redemption in Jesus Christ (Rom 3:23-24). Sinners who have gone astray are the first among those to receive his

recognition. Their joy fills the Easter season; they press in upon the risen Shepherd, so wondrous with his wounds and his humility. They are happy in his pastures: "The mysteries of God are good pasture. The words of Holy Scripture are pasture too" (Saint Ambrose). There the Good Shepherd gives his sheep the flesh and blood of the lamb which has been sacrificed for them to eat; he gives them himself to make them strong. He gives them the pure water of his divine word to drink & the milk of his mysteries.... Even when He leads along rough ways, it is always the good pasture that he has in sight for us at last. But not "good" in an earthly sense; Christ has brought no paradise on earth, but peace and everlasting life for the soul. The wild beasts, hatred, anger, envy, and every kind of sin, lie defeated in us beneath the powerful arm of the Shepherd.... Therefore the Church makes her thanksgiving today directly with the introit: "The merciful love of the Lord fills the earth" (cf. Ps 33:5, Entrance Antiphon).... What the mystery of Easter, what the mysteries of our incorporation into the flock have brought about will be perfected by our daily following of him along the shepherd's way **Between the pastures there lies the road of faithful devotion**... a desert way perhaps, but easily gone in the Lord's company.... The Lord has shown us recognition,

perhaps, but easily gone in the Lord's company.... The Lord has shown us recognition, and in baptism he has put his seal upon us. We were weak and imperfect, but God has recognized us as his own; he has shown us his love. May he grant that we may remain on his broad pastures forever, and be nourished with those mysteries as we go along the road of this life. —Sister Aemiliana Löhr, O.S.B.

un "conmovedor homenaje de fe y amor que los católicos de todo el mundo [rinden] a la Reina del Cielo. Durante este mes, los cristianos, tanto en la iglesia como en privado en el hogar, ofrecen a María desde el corazón un homenaje especialmente ferviente y amoroso de oración y veneración. También durante este mes, los

beneficios de la misericordia de Dios nos llegan desde su trono con mayor abundancia" (Pablo VI: Encíclica sobre el mes de mayo, n.º 1).

La piadosa práctica de honrar a María durante el mes de mayo ha sido especialmente recomendada por los Papas. Pío XII la mencionó con frecuencia en su gran Encíclica sobre la Sagrada Liturgia (Mediator Dei). El Papa Juan Pablo II dijo: «Hoy comenzamos el mes dedicado a Nuestra Señora, una de las favoritas de la devoción popular. Siguiendo una larga tradición de devoción, las parroquias y las familias continúan haciendo de mayo un mes «mariano», celebrándolo con numerosas iniciativas litúrgicas, catequéticas y pastorales».

ORACIÓN: Regina Caeli (versiones en español y latín)

Se concede indulgencia parcial a los fieles que reciten devotamente esta oración según la fórmula indicada para la época del año. Es una práctica loable recitar estas oraciones temprano por la mañana, al mediodía y por la noche.

The pious practice of honoring Mary during May has been especially recommended by the Popes. Pius XII made frequent reference to it & in his great Encyclical on the Sacred Liturgy (Mediator Dei). Pope John Paul II said, "Today we begin the month dedicated to Our Lady a favorite of popular devotion. In accord with a long-standing tradition of devotion, parishes and families continue to make May a 'Marian' month, celebrating it with many devout liturgical, catechetical, and pastoral initiatives!"

PRAYER: Regina Caeli (English & Latin versions)

A partial indulgence is granted to the faithful, who devoutly recite this according to the formula indicated for the time of the year. It is a praiseworthy practice to recite these prayers in the early morning, at noon, and in the evening.

English version

R. For he whom thou hast deserved to bear, alleluia,

R. Pray for us to God, alleluia.

Note: The authorship of the "Regina Caeli" is unknown. Legend says St. Gregory the Great (d. 604) heard the first three lines chanted by angels on a certain Easter morning in Rome as he walked barefoot in a great religious procession; the saint thereupon added the fourth line: "Ora pro nobis Deum. Alleluia." — Fr. Gant, moderator, Catholic News
