MEDITATION OF THE DAY

How We Glorify the Son

Mosaics, as we know, are made of many small tiles or stones.
The Church too can be compared to a mosaic, and in it each one of us can be considered a tile. But the tiles of this mosaic are not inanimate.

In the mosaic that is the Church, each one of us is a living tile. We understand where we fit in and are aware of our specific role in relation to everyone else and to the whole. While we know that each of us has

value only as part of the whole, we are also aware that if one of us is missing the mosaic is incomplete.

Not all the tiles of this mosaic are the same, of course. One of us, so to speak, might be a green tile, another a blue one, still another a golden or white one, and so on. That is, we all have a specific task to be carried out right where we are, an individual mission to remain faithful to. Thus, as tiles in the Church's mosaic, we must remain in the place assigned to us. Carrying out our specific duty, we give of ourselves, and this is also the best way to find true communion with our neighbors. We love them and, since they too live for others, they love us in return. Just like in a living body, this reciprocal giving and receiving increases the unity in the splendid mosaic that is the Church. **Such is the nature of the Church**, and we need to keep it in mind. Imagine, for example, a mosaic with the image of a young man. Someone might say, "Look at his beautiful and vivid eyes. Are they not the most beautiful part? I want to be the eye!" If others would say the same, imagine what kind of mosaic we would have. It would be

So let us remember that we are living tiles of the Church, all linked to one another, and each one participating in the whole. If a particular tile is missing, everyone lacks something, and all suffer the consequences. So we all need to accomplish our task faithfully, which means doing God's will moment by moment.

Venerémosla y recemos el rosario como Nuestra Señora de la Paz nos ha instruido a hacer".



La Capilla del Rito Oriental Bizantino-Ruteno, en la Basílica del Santuario Nacional de la Inmaculada Concepción, en Washington, D. C., recuerda la intervención de la Santísima Madre en el año 626 d. C. durante el asedio de Constantinopla. Temiendo por sus vidas, toda la población se congregó en la Iglesia de Blanquernas, que conservaba el famoso icono de la «Santa Protección». Durante una vigilia que duró toda la noche, imploraron su intercesión para salvarlos de las manos de sus enemigos. Welcome to May! This month is dedicated to Our Blessed Lady – the occasion for a "moving tribute of faith & love which Catholics in every part of the world [pay] to the Queen of Heaven. During May Christians, both in church & privately in the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer & veneration. Also during this month, the benefits of

God's mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance" (Paul VI: Encyclical on the Month of May, no. 1).

Father Chuck, in his May 1st email, reminded STM parishioners of this month's importance when he wrote, "...during May, this month of Our Lady, Mary, Mother of God ...Let's venerate her and pray the rosary as Our Lady of Peace has instructed us to do."

Protection

The Byzantine-Ruthenian Eastern Rite Chapel, at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, in Washington, D.C., recalls the intervention of the Blessed Mother in the year 626 A.D. during the siege of Constantinople. Fearing for their lives, the entire population gathered at the Church of Blachernae, which preserved the famous icon of the 'Holy Protection'. During an all-night vigil, they implored her intercession to save them from the hands of their enemies. According to eyewitness accounts, the Blessed Virgin appeared to those gathered in the church, sheltering them under her veil throughout the siege. In remembrance of this miraculous event, let us turn to Our Lady, Holy Protection of the Theotokos, and ask that she intercede for us as she did for the population of Constantinople, all those years ago:

PRAYER Our Lady, Holy Protection of the Theotokos

'O Mary, Mother of God, as you are above all creatures in heaven and on earth, more glorious than the Cherubim, more noble than any here below, Christ has given you to His people, firm bulwark and protectress, to shield and save sinners who fly to you. Therefore, O Lady, all-embracing refuge, we solemnly recall your sweet protection and beg the Christ forever for His mercy. Amen.'

CareNet Baby Bottle Campaign Underway While Planned Parenthood Abortions Hit Record High



Planned Parenthood (PP) released its fiscal year (FY) 2023-24 annual report which reinforces the BIG business of abortion!
In 2020 the PP annual report indicated that 200 abortions were performed for every adoption referral and during FY2020 354,871 abortions were performed. By FY2024 the number of abortions had risen to 402,200 – an all time high. It is believed that this rise is largely due to to Planned Parenthood's shift in focus to promoting dangerous, do-it-yourself chemical abortion pills.

Planned Parenthood once touted true health-care services such as cancer screenings & pap tests but today these services are in steep decline. The Charlotte Lozier Institute, a pro-life research & education organization, notes that since 2010, "[PPs] total cancer screening and prevention services have dropped by 74%; prenatal services down 72%," and "contraceptive services are down 41%." In contrast, its Big Abortion business is booming. Over just 5 years, July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2024, Planned Parenthood Annual Reports listed:

- \$633.4M in government funding, up from \$618.1M FY2020
- Total revenue around \$1.7B
- \$2.1+ billion in net assets
- \$500M+ annually in private funding from ~590K individuals
 - → <u>Not reported</u>: 1,907,401 abortions performed over just five years between July 1, 2019 and June 30, 2024.

These statistics are both alarming and sobering. Even so we are not without hope. It starts with prayer and continues with support of the pro-life activities of the Catholic Church, led in the U.S. by Most Rev. Daniel E. Thomas, Bishop of Toledo & Chairman of the USCCB Committee on Pro-Life Activities (visit https://www.usccb.org/prolife), and donations to organizations such as CareNet of Paradise.

The CareNet baby bottle campaign is in full swing. Pick up a baby bottle which you can fill with loose change, bills, and checks. Return it to St. Thomas More anytime between now & Father's Day, Sunday, June 15. Please give generously. It may feel like pushing a boulder up hill but we are making progress... one baby at a time. CareNet clients receive support, counseling, and, thanks to the sonogram machine donated by the STM Knights of Columbus, the vast majority of mothers who see a sonogram of their baby decide against abortion.
