MEDITATION OF THE DAY

Pray Always



Saint Alphonsus Liguori relates that Saint Teresa would have wished to ascend to the top of a high mountain, and be able to make her voice heard by the whole world, for the sole purpose of crying out to it: "Pray, pray, pray." She had rightly understood the words Our Lord addresses to each of us: We ought always to pray and not to faint (Lk 18:1).

In the spiritual life there are two great principles which should never be forgotten: Without grace we can do nothing; with it we can do all things. Sometimes it anticipates our desires; ordinarily, God waits till we ask for it. This is a general law thus expressed by Our Lord: Ask, and it shall be given to you. Prayer is, therefore, not only a precept, it is a necessity. God places the treasure of his graces at our disposal, and its key is prayer. You desire more faith, more hope, more love: Ask, and it shall be given to you. Your good resolutions remain sterile, resulting always in the same failures: Ask, and it shall be given to you. Precepts are numerous, virtue painful, temptation seductive, the enemy ruthless, the will weak: Ask, and it shall be given to you. Prayer will draw down into your soul the omnipotence of God....

"But I pray and I do not obtain." It is because you ask amiss. "I have been asking now for a long time." Ask again, seek, knock; reanimate your desires, importune heaven, make the voice of your soul loud and shrill as a piercing cry.... The Master of grace, Truth itself, has [given us] a promise supremely encouraging. The only reproach he makes us is that we do not ask enough. — Dom Vitalis Lehodey, o.c.r.



El Rosario, tal como lo conocemos, surgió a principios del siglo XIII, cuando Santo Domingo, sacerdote mendicante y talentoso predicador, se adentró en el bosque para ayunar y orar buscando una manera de derrotar la herejía albegentina y reconquistar las almas perdidas para Cristo. La Santísima Virgen María se le apareció y le entregó el Rosario, al que llamó su Salterio: 150 Avemarías divididas en 15 decenas. Nuestra Señora le dejó claro a Santo Domingo que la Salutación Angélica (el Ave María), unida a

October is the month of Devotion to the Rosary!

The Rosary as we know it came into being in the early 13th century, when a mendicant priest and gifted preacher, St. Dominic, went into the forest to fast & pray for a way to defeat the Albegentian heresy & win back lost souls to Christ. The Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to him, giving him the Rosary, which she called her Psalter – 150 Hail Marys divided into 15 decades. Our Lady made it clear to St. Dominic that the Angelic Salutation (the Hail Mary), joined with meditations on the mysteries of the Faith, would

defeat the errors of the Albegentians and turn hearts back to the Truth.

ÉXITOS EN BATALLA ATRIBUIDOS AL ROSARIO

- 1. La tradición primitiva atribuye la derrota de los albigenses en la batalla de Muret en 1213 al Rosario, cuando Santo Domingo, anhelando vencer la herejía albigense y reconquistar las almas perdidas para Cristo, se adentró en el bosque a ayunar y orar. En respuesta a sus oraciones, la Santísima Virgen María se le apareció y le entregó el Rosario.
- 2. La batalla de Lepanto y el Rosario están intrínsecamente vinculados porque el Papa Pío V pidió que se rezara el Rosario en toda Europa por la victoria contra la flota otomana en 1571. La Santa Liga Cristiana, a pesar de estar superada en número, ganó la batalla el 7 de octubre, y la victoria se atribuyó a la intercesión de la Virgen María a través de las oraciones del Rosario.
- 3. Una segunda gran victoria sobre los turcos, que en otro tiempo, como los rusos, amenazaban con la ruina de la civilización cristiana, se produjo el 5 de agosto de 1716, cuando el príncipe Eugenio los derrotó en Peterwardein, en Hungría.
- 4. Durante la Segunda Guerra Mundial, el líder del escuadrón Stan Fulton guiaba a sus hombres en el rezo del rosario cada noche antes de misiones peligrosas sobre Alemania. Les daba a cada hombre un rosario antes de los bombardeos, prometiéndoles la protección de la Virgen María. Según se informa, el escuadrón no perdió ni un solo avión ni una sola vida durante la guerra, y todos los hombres regresaron a casa.
- 5. El padre Hubert Schiffer, sacerdote jesuita, sobrevivió a la bomba atómica lanzada sobre Hiroshima en 1945; según se dice, sobrevivió en un edificio cerca del centro de la explosión, junto con otros sacerdotes que rezaban el rosario. En su libro, El Rosario de Hiroshima, escribió: «La oración es más poderosa que la bomba atómica…»

Hoy, cuando peligros mucho mayores amenazan no solo a la cristiandad, sino a toda la civilización, nuestra Santísima Madre nos insta a recurrir de nuevo al Rosario en busca de ayuda. Si el pueblo de Dios, en número suficiente, hace esto, y al mismo tiempo cumple las demás condiciones que Nuestra Señora ha establecido, tenemos mayor razón para confiar en que seremos librados de nuestros peligros. BATTLE SUCCESSES ATTRIBUTED TO THE ROSARY

If we consider the power of the Rosary as seen in its effects, we find a great abundance of proofs of its wonderful value. Many devoted users of the Rosary testify to experiencing its power in their lives and events:

- Early tradition attributes the defeat of the Albigensians at the Battle of Muret in 1213 to the Rosary when St. Dominic, who longed to overcome the Albegentian heresy & win back lost souls to Christ, went into the forest to fast & pray. In answer to his prayers, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to him, giving him the Rosary.
- 2. The Battle of Lepanto & the Rosary are intrinsically linked because Pope Pius V called for the Rosary to be prayed throughout Europe for victory against the Ottoman fleet in 1571. The Christian Holy League, despite being outnumbered, won the battle on October 7th, and the victory was attributed to the intercession of the Virgin Mary through the prayers of the Rosary.
- 3. A second great victory over the Turks, who once, like the Russians, threatened the ruin of Christian civilization, occurred on Aug. 5, 1716, when Prince Eugene defeated them at Peterwardein in Hungary.
- 4. During WWII, Squadron leader Stan Fulton led his men in praying the rosary each night before dangerous missions over Germany. He gave each man a rosary before the raids, promising the protection of the Virgin Mary. The squadron reportedly did not lose a single plane or life during the war, with all the men returning home.
- 5. Father Hubert Schiffer, a Jesuit priest, survived the atomic bomb dropped on Hiroshima in 1945; reportedly surviving in a building near the center of the blast, along with other priests who had been praying the rosary. In his book, The Rosary of Hiroshima, he wrote, "Prayer is more powerful than the atomic bomb..."

Today, when dangers far greater threaten not only Christianity but all civilization, we are urged by our Blessed Mother to turn again to the Rosary for help. If the people of God in sufficient numbers do this, and at the same time carry out the other conditions that Our Lady has laid down, we have a greater reason for confidence that we will be delivered from our dangers. Wednesday October 22	830A	Ghe Feast of St. John Paul II, commemorates a recent pope & champion of the Holy Rosary. Devoted to this prayer from his youth, John Paul II promoted it throughout his religious life, and as pope, he particularly called for the family recitation of the Rosary. He added the Luminous Mysteries to further the Faithful's catechetical meditation on the life of Christ.
Friday October 24	830A	St. Anthony (Dary Claret, honors the founder of the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary & fervent devotee of the Blessed Virgin Mary. St. Anthony is known to have begun every sermon with instructions on how to pray the Rosary, and he prayed three Rosaries every day. (Optional Memorial)
