MEDITATION OF THE DAY How to Unify the Activities of Our Life



Lord, you have given me a model for prayer: the Our Father. It is brief, concise, and packed with meaning. Your life, Lord, is a sincere and simple prayer addressed to your Father. Your prayer was sometimes long, like your ardent and spontaneous prayer after the Last Supper. But often your words, those of your Mother and apostles, were brief, linking together the actions of daily life. I, who often feel weak and indifferent, love to recall those brief prayers before the Eucharist, at my desk, in the street, alone. The more I repeat them, the more they penetrate me. I am close to you, Lord.

> Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do. Father, that they may be one. I am the handmaid of the Lord. They have no wine. Behold your son, behold your Mother! Remember me, when you come into your kingdom. Lord, what do you want me to do? Lord, you know all things, you know that I love you. Lord, have mercy on me, a poor sinner.

All of these brief prayers, linked one to another, form a life of prayer. Like a chain of discreet gestures, glances, and intimate words, they form a life of love. They keep us in an atmosphere of prayer not distracting us from our present tasks, but helping us to live our day more conscious of God. –VENERABLE FRANCIS XAVIER NGUYÈN VĂN THUÂN

HOMILY NOTES

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Julio está dedicado a la Preciosísima Sangre de Nuestro Señor. La Fiesta de la Preciosísima Sangre (1 de julio) fue instituida formalmente en 1849 por el Papa Pío IX, quien se encontraba exiliado de Roma en ese momento. Tuvo como

compañero a Don Giovanni Merlini, tercer general de la Congregación de la Preciosísima Sangre de Jesucristo. Este santo sacerdote sugirió al Papa que hiciera voto de dar la fiesta de la Preciosísima Sangre a toda la Iglesia, si recuperaba el territorio papal. Sin comprometerse con el voto, el Papa inmediatamente extendió la fiesta a toda la Iglesia. En el antiguo calendario se celebraba el 1 de julio, pero los católicos [hoy] continúan esta tradición aumentando su devoción a la Preciosísima Sangre durante todo el mes de julio.

UNA OBLIGACIÓN: LA DEVOCIÓN A LA PRECIOSA SANGRE

Los primeros Padres afirman que la Iglesia nació del costado traspasado de Cristo y que los sacramentos fueron traídos a través de su Sangre, lo que convierte esta devoción a la Preciosa Sangre en una obligación espiritual para todos los seguidores de Cristo. Las devociones pueden ser difíciles hoy en día con el crecimiento del secularismo; sin embargo, comprender sus beneficios debería fortalecer nuestra determinación. Véase más abajo.



July is dedicated to the Most Precious Blood of Our Lord. The Feast of the Precious Blood (July 1) was

formally instituted in 1849 by Pope Pius IX who was in exile from Rome at that time. His companion Don Giovanni Merlini, the third general of the Congregation

of the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ, suggested to the pope that he make a vow to give the feast of the Precious Blood to the entire church, if he should regain the papal territory. Without binding himself by the vow, the pope immediately extended the feast to the whole Church. On the old calendar it was celebrated July 1, but Catholics [today] continue this tradition by increasing their devotion to the most precious Blood for the entire month of July.

OBLIGATION & BENEFITS : DEVOTION TO THE PRECIOUS BLOOD

The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ & that the sacraments were brought forth thru His Blood which makes devotion to the Precious Blood a spiritual obligation for every follower of Christ. Devotions can be difficult in today's society as secularism grows; however, understanding their benefits (listed below) strengthen our resolve to honor this obligation.

Carlo Acutis & Pier Giorgio Frassati to be Canonized Sept. 7

Blessed Carlo Acutis & Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati, two young Catholics beloved for their vibrant faith and witness to holiness, will be canonized together on Sept. 7 in a canonization Mass in St. Peter's Square.

Acutis, who died of leukemia in 2006 at age 15, will become the first millennial to be declared a saint by the Catholic Church. Shortly before his death, Acutis offered his suffering from cancer "for the pope & for the Church." Many testified to the Vatican how he brought them closer to God.

Frassati, an avid mountaineer, who died at age 24 in 1925, is also beloved by many today for his enthusiastic witness to holiness that reaches "to the heights." A Third Order Dominican, known for his charitable outreach, was son of the founder of Italian newspaper La Stampa. Frassati died of polio on July 4, 1925, which his doctors later speculated was caught while serving the sick.
