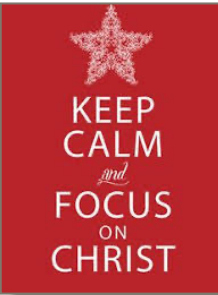

MEDITATION OF THE DAY

Trusting in the Father’s Plan

Every year at Christmas, as we look into the manger scene, we are reminded



of the simple yet profound truth of the Incarnation. We marvel that baby Jesus opened his human eyes to follow time and reside in space. If he who created time and space chose to willingly submit to it, may we likewise see the richness he found in it.

To human eyes, it may seem as though no one planned out the details for Jesus’ debut that wintry night, so primitive were the provisions. With thousands of years foretelling his coming through the prophets, was there no spare room to house him? Could not he who aligned the stars perfectly that night have planned things better than to have his Son born amidst stable animals in a stranger’s backyard?

Joseph and Mary, newly entrusted with raising the Son of God, would have been tempted to feel the weight of procuring the perfect place for Jesus’ birth.... [But] their focus that night—as it would be for the rest of time—was receiving the eternal love of the Father, moment by moment. The trust in the hearts of Joseph and Mary was in fact the perfect place for Jesus’ birth, as the Father intended. Our Father knew far too many of his children would be born in circumstances that seemed unprepared or unintended. In his goodness, the Father wanted no one to think the external circumstances had any bearing on their value. Through Jesus’ humble birth, the Father made plainly evident what really matters: rejoicing in the new life given. Each child that exists is proof of the Father’s planning.

From the moment of his birth, Jesus invited us to set our hearts on things above, not in what moth and rust consume. Our future lies in eternity, which is our only goal. The treasure of time, which Jesus jumped into so readily, is that it invites us to begin to receive eternity now. — SISTER FAUSTINA MARIA PIA, S.V.

El mes de diciembre está dedicado a la Inmaculada Concepción. Dedicamos este mes a la Inmaculada Concepción. El Papa Sixto IV estableció la festividad y misa oficial de la Inmaculada Concepción para el 8 de diciembre. Esta fecha fue elegida acertadamente, ya que es exactamente nueve meses antes de la Natividad de María, el 8 de septiembre.



The month of December is devoted to the Immaculate Conception. Pope Sixtus IV established the official feast and Mass of the Immaculate Conception on Dec. 8th. This date was fittingly selected, as it is exactly nine months before Mary's Nativity on September 8th.

LA PRIMERA SEÑAL DE SU VENIDA

En la tradición católica, diciembre es el primer mes del año litúrgico. Comenzamos el año en la espera de la venida del Niño Jesús, contemplando con asombro todo lo que significa su nacimiento. La Sagrada Escritura nos dice que la señal de la venida del Salvador es la Virgen (Isaías 7:14). Esta Virgen es la Madre de Dios y el Arca de la Nueva Alianza. Tres santos (citados a continuación en Las Glorias de María, de San Alfonso María de Liguori) coincidieron plenamente en su valoración de la pureza inmaculada de Nuestra Señora desde su concepción.

- **San Agustín, Doctor de la Iglesia**, escribió sobre la pureza de la Virgen María: "Dado que el diablo es la cabeza del pecado original, fue esta cabeza la que María aplastó: pues el pecado nunca tuvo entrada en el alma de esta Santísima Virgen, que, en consecuencia, estuvo libre de toda mancha" (Liguori 361).
- **San Juan Damasceno**, también conocido como San Juan de Damasco, fue un teólogo destacado y defensor de la fe contra las principales herejías de su tiempo. Él, también Doctor de la Iglesia, atestiguó firmemente la impecabilidad de María: «...nuestro Señor preservó el alma, junto con el cuerpo de la Santísima Virgen, en aquella pureza que convenía a quien iba a recibir a Dios en su seno; pues, siendo Él santo, solo reposa en lugares santos» (et al. 365).
- **San Buenaventura, Doctor de la Iglesia** y devoto de la Santísima Virgen, sostenía que Nuestra Señora estaba libre del pecado original, afirmando: "Era conveniente que la Santísima Virgen María, por quien nuestra vergüenza había de ser borrada y por quien el diablo había de ser vencido, nunca, ni siquiera por un instante, hubiera estado bajo su dominio" (et al. 361).

Nota: Consulte el Catecismo para obtener más detalles sobre el Beato Duns Escoto, quien defendió la verdad de la Inmaculada Concepción desde la perspectiva de la "prerredención" (153).

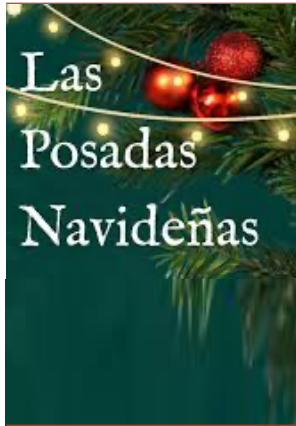

THE FIRST SIGN OF HIS COMING

In Catholic tradition, December is the first month of the Liturgical year. We begin the year in anticipation of the coming of the Christ Child, pondering with wonder all that His birth signifies. Sacred Scripture tells us that the sign of the coming of the Savior is the Virgin (Isaiah 7:14). This Virgin is the Mother of God & the Ark of the New Covenant. Three saints (below, quoted in *The Glories of Mary*, by St. Alphonsus Liguori, wholeheartedly agreed with their assessment of Our Lady's spotless purity from her conception.

- **St. Augustine, Doctor of the Church**, wrote of Our Lady's purity: "Since the devil is the head of original sin, this head it was that Mary crushed: for sin never had any entry into the soul of this Blessed Virgin, which was consequently free from all stain" (Liguori 361).
- **St. John Damascene**, also known as St. John of Damascus, was a prominent theologian and defender of the faith against the prominent heresies of his day. He, too, a Doctor of the Church firmly attested to the sinlessness of Mary: "... our Lord had preserved the soul, together with the body of the Blessed Virgin, in that purity which became her who was to receive a God into her womb; for, as he is holy, he only reposes in holy places" (et al. 365).
- **St. Bonaventure, Doctor of the Church**, devoted to the Blessed Virgin, held that Our Lady was free from original sin stating, "It was becoming that the Blessed Virgin Mary, by whom our shame was to be blotted out, and by whom the devil was to be conquered, should never, even for a moment, have been under his dominion" (et al. 361).

Note: See the Catechism for details on Blessed Duns Scotus who argued for the truth of the Immaculate Conception from the standpoint of "pre-redemption" ... (153).
