MEDITATION OF THE DAY

How to Prepare for Eternal Dwellings

Many people would give a great deal if they could lengthen their lives, though not in order to become more perfect but simply to live longer. For many people death is something fearsome. Although for us Catholics death no longer has its sting, there are still many of us who readily put up with everything only because we do not want to die. Death was something fearsome until Christ opened heaven's door for us & left for us many means of grace so that we can more easily attain eternal happiness.... Satan will risk everything

with many people in order to rob us at the last moment of eternal happiness.... However, we can pray fifty times or more each day: "Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us poor sinners now and at the hour of our deaths. Amen." Is it likely that the Blessed Mother will abandon us in our final hour if we say this prayer each day?...

Consider how fortunate many people would feel if someone were to give them an entire kingdom. Couldn't we compare such a gift with a single worthy reception of Communion? Yet not for long, for if someone could give us the entire world with all of its wealth and kingdoms, this would still be nothing in relation to a single, worthy reception of Communion. Think now about how infinitely fortunate we are to be able to go often to the table of the Lord.... Surely in every host there is the same Christ who contains the same high value. It can dawn on us how the reception of Communion will enrich us....

We must be ready therefore to give God everything: property and goods, body and soul. We must even be entirely prepared to die.... If we are able to approach the table of the Lord with such a willingness and surrender to God, then God will allow his wealth of grace to be imparted to us in the richest measure. So true peace and happiness will enter into our hearts. After every reception of Communion, we should say the following prayer: "My Lord and my God, I accept death whenever, wherever, and however it may encounter me according to your most holy decree. I accept it willingly with all of its anxieties, pains, and sufferings, and I receive it out of your fatherly hands." – Blessed Franz Jäcerstätter

HOMILY NOTES				

La devoción a Nuestra Señora de los Dolores destaca el mes de septiembre.

Esta devoción nos fue dada por Santa Brígida de Suecia (1303-1373), a quien se le reveló que la devoción a los Siete Dolores de la Santísima Virgen traería grandes gracias. Santo Tomás Moro celebrará la Conmemoración de Nuestra Señora de los Dolores el martes 16 de septiembre en la misa de las 18:00 (que sigue al sacramento de la reconciliación).



The Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows highlights of the month of September. This devotion is given to us by St. Bridget of Sweden (1303–1373) to whom it was revealed that devotion to the Blessed Virgin's Seven Sorrows would bring great graces. St. Thomas More will celebrate the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows on Tuesday, Sept. 16 at the 6p Mass (which follows the sacrament of reconciliation.)

La devoción a Nuestra Señora de los Dolores se convirtió en un estándar en la Iglesia alrededor del siglo XIV y varios Papas la fomentaron.

El domingo pasado compartimos las siete gracias que la Santísima Virgen María reveló a Santa Brígida de Suecia (1303-1373) y que serían concedidas a las almas que la honraran diariamente rezando siete Avemarías y meditando en sus lágrimas y dolores. Este domingo compartimos las revelaciones complementarias que San Alfonso María de Ligorio testifica que fueron dadas por Nuestro Señor a Santa Isabel de Hungría (1207-1231), en las que Jesús promete además cuatro gracias especiales a quienes se dedican a los sufrimientos de la madre corredentora.

Las cuatro gracias especiales que Jesús promete

- 1. Jesús promete que quienes antes de morir invoquen a la Santísima Madre en nombre de sus dolores obtendrán el verdadero arrepentimiento de todos sus pecados.
- 2. Jesús promete que protegerá en sus tribulaciones a todos los que recuerden esta devoción, y que los guardará especialmente en la hora de la muerte.
- 3. Jesús promete que grabará en sus mentes el recuerdo de su Pasión y que recibirán su recompensa por ella en el Cielo.
- 4. Jesús promete que encomendará a estos devotos clientes en manos de María para que Ella obtenga para estas almas todas las gracias que Ella quiere prodigarles.

En una locución (una forma de revelación privada) recibida por la mística belga Berthe Petit (1870–1943), Jesús explica las gracias especiales (arriba) otorgadas a través de la devoción al Corazón Doloroso e Inmaculado de María. A Berthe Petit, nuestro Señor le dijo de estas cuatro gracias especiales que "Esta devoción al Corazón Doloroso e Inmaculado de Mi madre restaurará la fe y la esperanza a los corazones rotos y a las familias arruinadas; ayudará a reparar la destrucción; endulzará el dolor. Será una nueva fuerza para Mi Iglesia, llevando a las almas no solo a la confianza en Mi Corazón sino también al abandono al Corazón Doloroso de Mi madre".

Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows became a standard in the Church around the 14th century with several Popes encouraging it.

Last Sunday we shared the seven graces The Blessed Virgin Mary revealed to St. Bridget of Sweden (1303-1373) that would be granted to the souls who honor her daily by saying seven Aves and meditating on her tears and dolours (sorrows).

This Sunday we share the complementary revelations St. Alphonsus de Liguori testifies to that were given by Our Lord to St. Elizabeth of Hungary (1207-1231) in which Jesus further promises four special graces to those dedicated to the sufferings of the co-redeeming mother.

THE FOUR SPECIAL GRACES JESUS PROMISES

- 1. Jesus promises that those who, before death, invoke the Blessed Mother in the name of her sorrows should obtain true repentance of all their sins.
- 2. Jesus promises that He would protect in their tribulations all who remember this devotion, and that He would guard them especially at the hour of death.
- 3. Jesus promises that He would impress upon their minds the remembrance of His Passion, and that they should have their reward for it in Heaven.
- 4. Jesus promises that He would commit such devout clients into the hands of Mary so that she might obtain for these souls all the graces she wanted to lavish upon them.

In a locution (a form of private revelation) received by the Belgian mystic Berthe Petit (1870–1943), Jesus explains the special graces (above) granted thru devotion to Mary's Sorrowful & Immaculate Heart. To Berthe Petit, our Lord has said of these four special graces that "This devotion to the Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of My mother will restore faith and hope to broken hearts and to ruined families; it will help to repair the destruction; it will sweeten sorrow. It will be a new strength for My Church, bringing souls not only to confidence in My Heart but also to abandonment to the Sorrowful Heart of My mother."

Both saints had a great sense of humor during their brief lives. Pier Giorgio Frassati (April 6, 1901 – July 4, 1925), the mountaineering "Man of the Beatitudes," was also the prank mastermind of his friend group, the Tipi Loschi. On retreats, he was notorious for short-sheeting beds – including those of the priests (the temerity!).

Decades later, Carlo Acutis (May 3, 1991 – Oct. 12, 2006) carried that same joyful mischief. Not a perfect student... sometimes forgot his homework or showed up late but had a 'healthy curiosity' and 'wanted to get to the bottom of things'....Religion classes for Carlo were moments when "he was more passionate than others and more alive.
