MEDITATION OF THE DAY

Holy Love, Holy Families



My dearest Gianna: I'm still beside myself with the joy you have given me by our engagement, that sweet joy renewed at every moment knowing that your thoughts, affections, and desires are directed toward me, that sweetest joy which I hope will be just as great in you.... In return for the gift of your heart and your love, my heart is all yours, and my love will be only and always for you, O my dearest Gianna. You are my jewel, delicate and so beautiful in virtue and goodness....

My love for you will always be brighter than the light reflecting from our engagement ring. The lovely watch you gave me will be with me during the most beautiful time of my life: the time of our love, of our family. You are the strong woman I begged heaven for, and whom our heavenly Mother has given me. I entrust my whole heart to you forever, and I will receive everything good from you.... To me you are the strong woman of the Gospel. When I am with you, my joy is full....

I still see you, so devout during our engagement Holy Mass, and I am certain of the divine blessing called down on us by dear Father Giuseppe. I see you & I again rejoice in thinking how beautiful & sweet you were to everyone on our engagement afternoon. I am thinking of you & embrace you with all my love, Your Pietro.

My dearest Pietro: Today of all days, when I wasn't expecting to enjoy your dear company, I have you even closer to me: I received your letter. Pietro, thank you for being so good and affectionate. Your words touched me, and I'm happy that in answer to my question, "How should I be to make you happy?" you answer I should continue to be good, affectionate, and understanding as I am now. I will, dearest Pietro, and it will be easy, because you are so good to me. I already knew that you loved me, but being reminded of your love through your letter today filled my heart with joy. Just think, Pietro, what a great gift the Lord has given to us; how thankful we must always be for it! – SAINT GIANNA BERETTA AND PIETRO MOLLA

Saint Gianna († 1962) was an Italian medical doctor who died at the age of 39. Pietro († 2010) was an engineer. Their daughter, Gianna Emanuela, became a doctor and internationally sought-after speaker. HOMILY NOTES

El mes de diciembre, dedicado a la Inmaculada Concepción, culmina con la Solemnidad de María, Madre de Dios, el 1 de enero, que es un día de precepto.



The month of December, devoted to the Immaculate Conception, culminates with the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, on January 1, which is a Holy Day of Obligation.

EL PAPEL DE MARÍA COMO MADRE DE DIOS*

El arzobispo Cordileone, de la Arquidiócesis de San Francisco, enfatiza el papel de María como Madre de Dios, modelo de fe y fuente de unidad, especialmente en días como la Solemnidad de María, Madre de Dios (1 de enero) y la Asunción (15 de agosto), que son días de precepto. Habla de ella como un vínculo de unión entre los pueblos, como en México, e insta a los católicos a recurrir a su intercesión, considerándola la discípula perfecta que muestra cómo actúa la gracia, y los anima a asistir a misa en estas importantes fiestas marianas como parte fundamental de la vida cristiana.

A continuación se enumeran cuatro atributos clave de la Santísima Madre de Dios, según el arzobispo Cordileone:

1. *Discípula ejemplar:* María es el ejemplo supremo de fe, esperanza y amor, mostrando el camino al cielo a través de la gracia.
2. *Figura unificadora:* María, particularmente a través de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe, une a diversos pueblos y culturas, fomentando un nuevo pueblo cristiano.
3. *Llamada a la oración:* Cordileone anima a la oración ferviente a María como nuestra Madre amorosa y poderosa intercesora, haciendo referencia al llamado de San Bernardo: "¡Mira a la Estrella! ¡Invoca a María!".
4. *Necesidad espiritual:* La celebración de estas fiestas no es solo una norma, sino una participación vital en la obra de Cristo, una manera de encontrar belleza y unidad en un mundo fragmentado.

Nota: La iglesia católica de Santo Tomás Moro celebrará la Solemnidad de María, Madre de Dios, el jueves 1 de enero con dos misas: a las 10:30 a. m. (en inglés) y a las 6:00 p. m. (en español).

MARY'S ROLE AS MOTHER OF GOD *

Archbishop Cordileone, Archbishop of the Archdiocese of San Francisco, emphasizes Mary's role as Mother of God, our model of faith, and a source of unity, particularly on days like the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God (Jan 1) and Assumption (Aug 15), which are Holy Days of Obligation. He speaks of her as uniting peoples, like in Mexico, and calls Catholics to turn to her for intercession, seeing her as the perfect disciple who shows how grace works, urging attendance at Mass on these significant Marian feasts as a core part of Christian life.

Listed below are four key attributes of the Holy Mother of God according to Archbishop Cordileone:


1. *Model Disciple:* Mary is the ultimate example of faith, hope, and love, showing the path to heaven through grace.
2. *Unifying Figure:* Mary, particularly through Our Lady of Guadalupe, unites diverse peoples and cultures, fostering a new Christian people.
3. *Call to Prayer:* Cordileone encourages fervent prayer to Mary as our loving Mother and powerful intercessor, referencing St. Bernard's call to "Look to the Star! Call on Mary!".
4. *Spiritual Necessity:* Observing these feasts isn't just a rule but a vital participation in Christ's work, a way to find beauty and unity in a fragmented world.


Note: St. Thomas More Catholic Church will celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, on Thursday, January 1 with two Masses: 1030A (English) and 6P (Español).
