

MEDITATION OF THE DAY  
The Light That Glorifies God

**We have to examine the intention of the human heart**, where it is aimed, what it has in mind. If anybody wants his good works to be seen by other people because he is parading his glory and his indispensability before their eyes, and seeking recognition of them from other people, then... his light

has not so shone before men, that they should see his good works for the purpose of glorifying the Father in heaven. It's himself that he wanted glorified, not God; and it was his own profit he was looking for, not the will of the Lord he was choosing. Of such people the apostle says, They are all looking after their own interests, not those of Jesus Christ (Phil 2:21)....

**Jesus said, So let your light shine before men that they may see your good works;** but he immediately added why this was to be done: that they may glorify, he said, your Father in heaven. So when a person is seen by people to do good, his conscience should be prompted by the intention to do good, but not by any intention of getting well known for it, except for the praise of God and the advantage of those who get to know about it. The benefit they get from [another's good works] is being delighted with God who has enabled a person to do such things; and so not giving up hope if they want such a capacity for doing good to be granted to them as well!...

**So if anybody wishes his works to be seen by the public in such a way that God is glorified**, from whom he has received the things that are seen in him, and so that the very people who see them are challenged...to imitate his good works–then his light really does shine before the world, because it is the brightness of charity that he radiates. – SAINT AUGUSTINE

## HOMILY NOTES

**¡Bienvenidos a febrero! Este mes está dedicado a la Sagrada Familia, una rica tradición que nos invita a reflexionar sobre la importancia eterna de la vida familiar dentro de la tradición católica.**

La Iglesia instituyó oficialmente la Fiesta de la Sagrada Familia en 1893, cuando el Papa León XIII la aprobó. Posteriormente, en 1921, el Papa Benedicto XV la extendió a toda la Iglesia, tras el desarrollo de esta devoción en el siglo XVII.

**San Juan Pablo II enfatizó la importancia de la familia** como iglesia doméstica y animó a las familias a tomar como modelo a la Sagrada Familia.

En su encíclica *Familiaris Consortio*, expone los peligros y desafíos que la cultura actual plantea a la familia. Como respuesta, anima a las familias católicas invocando la protección de la Sagrada Familia de Nazaret, diciendo:


*«Por designio misterioso de Dios, fue en esa familia donde el Hijo de Dios vivió largos años de vida oculta. Por lo tanto, es el prototipo y ejemplo para todas las familias cristianas.»*

“[La Sagrada Familia] experimentó las pruebas de la pobreza, la persecución y el exilio. Glorificó a Dios de una manera incomparablemente sublime y pura. Y no dejará de ayudar a las familias cristianas –y, de hecho, a todas las familias del mundo– a ser fieles a sus deberes cotidianos, a sobrellevar las preocupaciones y tribulaciones de la vida, a ser abiertas y generosas ante las necesidades de los demás, y a cumplir con alegría el plan de Dios para ellas.”

## OCHO MANERAS DE CRECER EN DEVOCIÓN A LA SAGRADA FAMILIA

1. Recen el Rosario en familia, centrándose especialmente en los Misterios Gozosos. Mediten en la devoción de Jesús, María y José, quienes expresaban su adoración a Dios Padre mientras vivían en Nazaret.
2. Consagren a su familia a la Sagrada Familia. \*
3. Fortalezcan la devoción de su familia a la Eucaristía, como alimento de la vida familiar, asistiendo juntos a Misa los domingos y siempre que sea posible.
4. Lean, memoricen o representen historias bíblicas que destaque a la Sagrada Familia. Por ejemplo: El nacimiento de Jesús (Lucas 2:1-20), La huida a Egipto (Mateo 2:13-15) o El hallazgo del Niño Jesús en el templo (Lucas 2:41-52).
5. Coloquen una imagen o un ícono de la Sagrada Familia en su casa.
6. Pidan a su sacerdote que bendiga su hogar.
7. Practica la caridad de la Sagrada Familia mediante actos de perdón y paciencia hacia los miembros de tu familia.
8. Esfúérzate por vivir una vida que refleje las virtudes de la Sagrada Familia; imita su amor, obediencia, unidad y humildad.

**Welcome to February! This month is devoted to the Holy Family, a rich tradition that invites us to reflect on the eternal significance of family life within the Catholic tradition.**

The Church officially instituted the Feast of the Holy Family in 1893 when Pope Leo XIII approved it. It was later extended to the universal Church in 1921 by Pope Benedict XV, following the development of the devotion in the 17th century.

**Saint John Paul II emphasized the importance of the family** as the domestic church and encouraged families to model themselves after the Holy Family.

In his encyclical, *Familiaris Consortio*, he expounds on the dangers and challenges against the family by the current culture. As a response he encourages the Catholic family with an invocation for the protection of the Holy Family of Nazareth, saying,


*“Through God’s mysterious design, it was in that family that the Son of God spent long years of a hidden life. It is therefore the prototype and example for all Christian families.”*

“[The Holy Family] underwent trials of poverty, persecution, and exile. It glorified God in an incomparably exalted and pure way. And it will not fail to help Christian families – indeed, all the families in the world – to be faithful to their day-to-day duties, to bear the cares and tribulations of life, to be open and generous to the needs of others, and to fulfill with joy the plan of God in their regard.”

## EIGHT WAYS TO GROW IN DEVOTION TO THE HOLY FAMILY

1. Pray the Rosary as a family, especially focusing on the Joyful Mysteries. Meditate on the devotion of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph expressing adoration to God the Father while in Nazareth.
2. Consecrate your family to the Holy Family. \*
3. Strengthen your family's devotion to the Eucharist – as a nourishment of family life by attending Mass together on the Sunday obligation and whenever possible.
4. Read, memorize, or act out Scripture stories highlighting the Holy Family. For example, *The Birth of Jesus* (Luke 2:1-20), *The Flight into Egypt* (Matthew 2:13-15), or *The Finding of the Child Jesus in the Temple* (Luke 2:41-52).
5. Place an image or icon of the Holy Family in your house.
6. Ask your priest to bless your home.
7. Practice the charity of the Holy Family by acts of forgiveness and patience toward your family members.
8. Strive to live a life that reflects the virtues of the Holy Family; imitate their love, obedience, unity, and humility.

## STATEMENT ON IMMIGRATION FROM THE U.S. COUNCIL OF CATHOLIC BISHOPS

The Bishops overwhelmingly approved this Special Pastoral Message on Immigration:

"As pastors, we the bishops of the United States, are bound to our people by ties of communion and compassion in Our Lord Jesus Christ. We are disturbed when we see among our people a climate of fear and anxiety around questions of profiling and immigration enforcement. We are saddened by the state of contemporary debate and the vilification of immigrants. We are concerned about the conditions in detention centers and the lack of access to pastoral care. We lament that some immigrants in the United States have arbitrarily lost their legal status. We are troubled by threats against the sanctity of houses of worship and the special nature of hospitals and schools. We are grieved when we meet parents who fear being detained when taking their children to school and when we try to console family members who have already been separated from their loved ones."

Bishop Soto wants our Diocese to be aware of this statement which was written & approved unanimously by the USCCB at their Nov. 2025 meeting. Direct any questions to Fr. Chuck.
