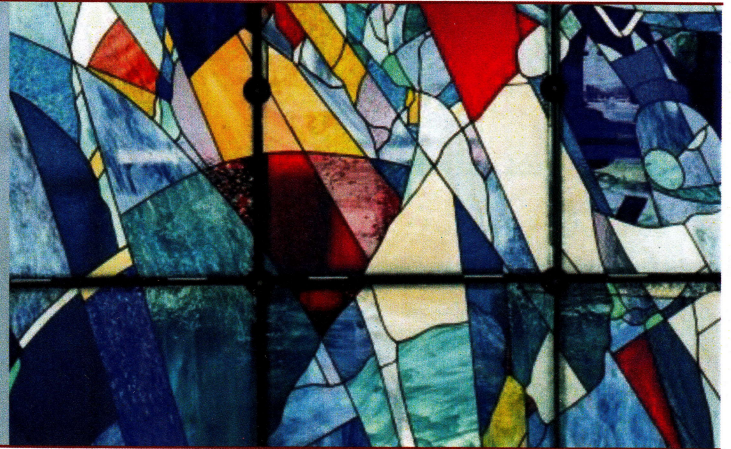

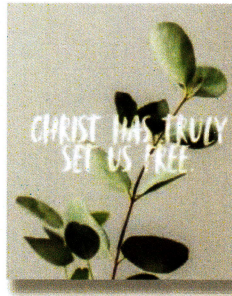

MEDITATION OF THE DAY**Set Free by Christ's Law****In God alone can the human will find absolute and perfect peace.** God is the only end of man. All our life on earth is the truthful and exact image of a pilgrimage. Now

Christ is the "Way," for we can never reach God, the supreme and ultimate good, by this toilsome and doubtful road of mortal life, except with Christ as our leader and guide. How so? Firstly and chiefly by his grace; but this would remain "void" in man if the precepts of his law were neglected. For as

was necessarily the case after Jesus Christ had won our salvation, he left behind him his Law for the protection and welfare of the human race, under the guidance of which men, converted from evil life, might safely tend towards God. Going, teach ye all nations...teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you (Mt 28:19-20)....

Various natural appetites attract man on one side and the other; the allurements of the material world impel his soul to follow after what is pleasant rather than the law of Christ. Still, we must strive our best and resist our natural inclinations with all our strength unto the obedience of Christ. For unless they obey reason, they become our masters, and carrying the whole man away from Christ, make him their slave....**In this contest, every man must be prepared to undergo hardships and troubles for Christ's sake.** It is difficult to reject what so powerfully entices and delights. It is hard and painful to despise the supposed goods of the senses and of fortune for the will and precepts of Christ our Lord. But the Christian is absolutely obliged to be firm, and patient in suffering, if he wish to lead a Christian life....**It is reasonable, therefore, not to expect an end to troubles in this world,** but rather to steel one's soul to bear troubles, by which we are taught to look forward with certainty to supreme happiness. ¡Bienvenidos a febrero! Este mes está dedicado a la Sagrada Familia, una rica tradición que nos invita a reflexionar sobre la importancia eterna de la vida familiar dentro de la tradición católica.

La Iglesia instituyó oficialmente la Fiesta de la Sagrada Familia en 1893, cuando el Papa León XIII la aprobó. Posteriormente, en 1921, el Papa Benedicto XV la extendió a toda la Iglesia, tras el desarrollo de esta devoción en el siglo XVII.

[La Sagrada Familia] sufrió las pruebas de la pobreza, la persecución y el exilio. Glorificó a Dios de una manera incomparablemente exaltada y pura. Y sin duda ayudará a las familias cristianas —de hecho, a todas las familias del mundo— a ser fieles a sus deberes cotidianos, a soportar las preocupaciones y las tribulaciones de la vida, a ser abiertas y generosas a las necesidades de los demás y a cumplir con alegría el plan de Dios para con ellas.— San Juan Pablo II

CONSAGRANDO TU FAMILIA A LA SAGRADA FAMILIA

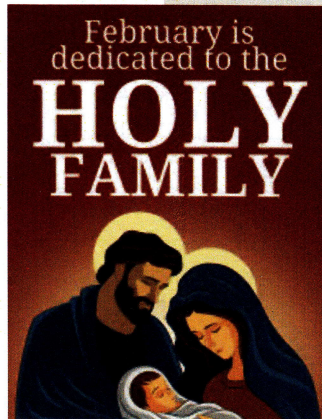

The month of February is devoted to the Holy Family, a rich tradition that invites us to reflect on the eternal significance of family life within the Catholic tradition.

The Church officially instituted the Feast of the Holy Family in 1893 when Pope Leo XIII approved it. It was later extended to the universal Church in 1921 by Pope Benedict XV, following the development of the devotion in the 17th century.

“[The Holy Family] underwent trials of poverty, persecution, and exile. It glorified God in an incomparably exalted and pure way. And it will not fail to help Christian families – indeed, all the families in the world – to be faithful to their day-to-day duties, to bear the cares and tribulations of life, to be open and generous to the needs of others, and to fulfill with joy the plan of God in their regard.” — St. John Paul II

One of the key ways to increase devotion to the Holy Family is to consecrate your family to them through the prayers below –

CONSECRATING YOUR FAMILY TO THE HOLY FAMILY

O Jesus, our most loving Redeemer, who, having come to enlighten the world with Your teaching and example, did will to spend the greater part of Your life in humility and subjection to Mary and Joseph in the poor home of Nazareth, thus sanctifying the Family that was to be an example for all Christian families, graciously receive our family as it dedicates and consecrates itself to You this day. Protect us, guard us, and establish among us Your holy fear, true peace, and concord in Christian love: so that by living according to the divine pattern of Your family we may be able, all of us without exception, to attain to eternal happiness.

Mary, dear Mother of Jesus and Mother of us, by your kindly intercession, make this, our humble offering, acceptable in the sight of Jesus, and obtain for us His graces and blessings.

O Saint Joseph, most holy Guardian of Jesus and Mary, help us by your prayers in all our spiritual and temporal needs; so that we may be enabled to praise our divine Savior Jesus, together with Mary and you, for all eternity.
