

MEDITATION OF THE DAY



Hymn of the seraphim (Is 6:3). Do not reject them like those of Cain, but embrace them like Abel's offering (Gn 4:4), through her who gave you birth, and through whom you have been born for us, a little Child, God

before the ages.

When the blameless Virgin saw the magi bringing new & radiant gifts and worshiping, the star showing him, the shepherds praising him, she implored the Maker and Creator of all these, saying, "Accept, my Child, a trinity of gifts, grant her who gave you birth three requests. I pray to you for the seasons and for the fruits of the earth and for those who dwell on it. Be reconciled to all, because through me you have been born a little Child, God before the ages.

"For I am not simply your mother, compassionate Savior; it is not in vain that I suckle the giver of milk, but for the sake of all I implore you. You have made me the mouth and the boast of all my race (Jdt 15:9) and your world has me as a mighty protection, a wall and a buttress. They look to me, those who were cast out of the Paradise of pleasure, for I bring them back. May all things understand that, through me, you have been born a little Child, God before the ages.

"Save the world, O Savior. For this you have come. Set your whole universe aright. For this you have shone on me and on the magi and on all creation. For see, the magi, to whom you have shown the light of your face, fall down before you and offer gifts, useful, fair, and eagerly sought. For I have need of them, since I am about to go to Egypt and to flee with you and for you, my Guide, my Son, my Maker, my Redeemer, a little Child, God before the ages."—SAINT ROMANOS THE MELODIST

HOMILY NOTES			

Enero está dedicado al Santo Nombre de Jesús, el cual se celebra el 3 de enero, como una forma formal y señalada para darle honor al Nombre de Jesús. "En el nombre de Jesús se doble

toda rodilla de los que están en el cielo, en la tierra y debajo de la tierra"

(Flp 2,10). La veneración del Nombre de Jesús se remonta al siglo XIV. San Bernardino de Siena y sus discípulos difundieron la veneración del Nombre de Jesús en el siglo XV.

El monograma (arriba, derecha) que representa el Santo Nombre de Jesús son las primeras tres letras del nombre griego de Jesús: lota (I), Eta (H) y Sigma (S). Los jesuitas hicieron del monograma IHS el emblema de su sociedad agregando una cruz sobre la H y tres clavos debajo.

Como católicos, dedicamos el Año Nuevo a María en la solemnidad del 1 de enero, honrándola como Madre de Dios. el 8 de enero, Solemnidad de la Epifanía, nos alegramos con ella, mientras su Hijo es adorado por los Reyes Magos.

Juan, el Bautista, quien marcó el comienzo del tiempo de Adviento, está presente una vez más para cerrar la Navidad en la fiesta del Bautismo de Nuestro Señor (El Primer Misterio Luminoso), y para abrir el Tiempo Ordinario. Señala a Jesús, el Cordero de Dios que une el tiempo y la eternidad en el Sacrificio Eucarístico, e incluso la oscuridad cada vez menor de enero parece hacer eco de la oración de San Juan: "Él debe crecer y yo menguar".

January is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus, which was celebrated on January 3, as a formal way and appointed time to give honor to The Name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those that are in

heaven, on earth and under the earth" (Phil 2:10). The veneration of the Name of Jesus dates back to the 14th century. St. Bernardine of Siena and his disciples spread the veneration of the Name of Jesus in the 15th century.

The monogram (above, left) representing the Holy Name of Jesus is the first three letters of the Greek name of Jesus: lota (I), Eta (H), and Sigma (S). The Jesuits made the IHS monogram the emblem of their society by adding a cross over the H and three nails underneath it. As Catholics, we dedicated the New Year to Mary on the January 1st Solemnity, honoring her as Mother of God. on January 8, the Solemnity of Epiphany, we rejoice with her, as her Son is adored by the three Wise Men.

John, the Baptist, who ushered in the Advent season, is present once again to close Christmastide on the feast of the Baptism of Our Lord (The First Luminous Mystery), and to open the Season of Ordinary Time. He points to Jesus, the Lamb of God who unites time and eternity in the Eucharistic Sacrifice, and even January's diminishing darkness seems to echo St. John's prayer: "He must increase and I must decrease."

PRAYER TO THE HOLY NAME OF JESUS

O good Jesu, according to Thy great mercy, have mercy on me. O most merciful Jesu, by that Precious Blood which Thou didst will to shed for sinners, I beseech Thee to wash away all my iniquities and to look graciously upon me, a poor and unworthy sinner, as I call upon Thy holy Name. Therefore, O Jesus, do Thou save me for Thy holy Name's sake. Amen


About the Pope's Prayer Intentions
